<u>HB 131, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR24)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOBILITY MANAGEMENT. Establishes a task force on mobility management. Requires the task force to establish a transportation framework to assist elders and individuals with disabilities with transportation needs in rural communities. Appropriates funds.	HUS, TRN, FIN
<u>HB 751</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO SADDLE ROAD. Renames saddle road as the Daniel K. Inouye legacy highway.	TRN, FIN
<u>HB 170, HD1</u> <u>(HSCR46)</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO VETERANS. Exempts certain totally and permanently disabled veterans from paying the State motor vehicle registration fee. (HB170 HD1)	VMI, TRN, FIN
<u>HB 66</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF AN INTOXICANT. Imposes conditions to ensure that persons arrested for driving under the influence of an intoxicant are sober prior to being released from custody.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1181</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DRIVING UNDER THE INFLUENCE. Amends the definition of a "habitual offender" to also mean a person who was convicted of habitually operating a vehicle under the influence of an intoxicant within ten years of the instant offense of operating a motor vehicle under the influence of an intoxicant.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 133</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLE DRIVER LICENSING. Authorizes courts to revoke or suspend instruction permits for drivers who commit traffic offenses.	TRN, JUD
<u>HB 1440</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO DRIVER EDUCATION. Requires driver education programs to include the distribution of information on organ and tissue donation.	TRN, HLT



HB 572  
Status

RELATING TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE INDUSTRY LICENSING ACT. TRN, CPC  
Requires annual used motor vehicle site inspections. Requires motor vehicle insurance on a vehicle prior to release from auction. Requires motor vehicles to be insured prior to release from auction. Amends requirements to obtain a dealer license. Amends bond requirements in lieu of a flooring line of credit.

HB 979  
Status

RELATING TO HARBORS. TRN, JUD  
Authorizes the Department of Transportation to adopt rules to impose upon private parties who use state commercial harbors the duty to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the State against claims that arise from such use.

DECISION MAKING TO FOLLOW

Persons wishing to offer comments should submit testimony at least 24 hours prior to the hearing. Testimony should indicate:

While every effort will be made to incorporate all testimony received, materials received on the day of the hearing or improperly identified or directed, may be distributed to the Committee after the hearing.

Submit testimony in ONE of the following ways:


WEB: For testimony less than 10MB in size, transmit from <http://www.capitol.hawaii.gov/submittestimony.aspx>.

Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.

**If during the course of the hearing it appears that there will not be sufficient time to allow everyone to be heard, the chairperson reserves the right to limit the remaining testifiers to three minutes. This three minute policy will be enforced to ensure fairness and adequate consideration to all bills.**
