<u>HB 1419</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE PACIFIC INTERNATIONAL SPACE CENTER FOR EXPLORATION SYSTEMS. Appropriates funds to PISCES.	HED/EDB, FIN
<u>HB 71</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO HIGH TECHNOLOGY. Requires the University of Hawaii to extend the current land lease with the high technology development corporation for no less than 25 years from the date of expiration of the existing lease.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 1025</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE CENTER FOR OKINAWAN STUDIES. Appropriates funds for the hiring of one full-time equivalent librarian position for the Okinawan collection at the University of Hawaii at Manoa library.	HED, FIN
<u>HB 1069</u> <u>Status</u>	RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII. Repeals the authority of the University of Hawaii to issue revenue bonds.	HED, FIN



HB 1070  
Status

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.  
Requires the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to undergo annual training on board policies and procedures, chapter 92, Hawaii's sunshine law, and chapter 92F, Hawaii's open records law. Requires the board of regents to receive certification that the regent successfully completed the training. Provides that the certification may include passing a test on the training's subject matter. Requires members of the board of regents to be removed from office if they do not meet the annual training requirements more than once during their term.

HB 1072  
Status

RELATING TO THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.  
Requires members of the board of regents of the University of Hawaii to file an annual disclosure of financial interests with the state ethics commission. Makes the disclosures public record and available for inspection and duplication.

HB 1073  
Status

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.  
Amends section 304A-1005, HRS, to: (1) Limit the board of regents to appointing only one university general counsel; (2) Require the board of regents to have direct oversight over the university counsel and prohibit the board of regents from delegating this responsibility to the president of the university; (3) Require the university general counsel to report directly to the board of regents; and (4) Allow the board of regents to contract with independent attorneys solely in cases where the university general counsel and attorney general each acknowledge a lack of sufficient expertise. Requires contracted attorneys to consult with and work in conjunction with the attorney general.


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
Testimony submitted will be placed on the legislative website after the hearing adjourns. This public posting of testimony on the website should be considered when including personal information in your testimony.
