Representative Cabanilla: "Thank you for the question. I will leave it to the Member of the House. Because if they say they have a lot of Filipinos, they quantify that there's a lot of Filipinos, then I will take their word for it, because I'm not about to go count them."

Representative Ward: "Mr. Speaker, being that we are State Representatives, we represent all the Filipinos, all the Chinese, all the everybody, but some of them may not be quite as quantitatively in our own districts as others, so I just wanted a clarification. So I get the impression its self-selection. Thank you."

Vice Speaker Mizuno: "I believe so, and Representative Ward you could attend that meeting if you would like, so that might be in your best interest."

Representative Ward: "I was trying to hint that, actually."

Representative Cabanilla: "I am open to any more questions that they may have. That's why I'm standing. And I'll be happy to explain why we are reverting to the old policy when the Filipino Caucus came about."

And I remember when he was shot and what that felt like. How it went through all of us, the whole United States felt that. And probably the world. Because it was a significant point in American history. So I just wanted to point that out to everybody. Thank you."
