RELATING TO LONG TERM CARE. HLT/CPC, FIN HB₁

> Requires the director of the executive office on aging to contract for the performance of an actuarial analysis for a limited, mandatory, public long term care insurance program for the State's working population. Requires a report to the legislature. Appropriates funds for the actuarial analysis.

HB2 RELATING TO LONG TERM CARE. HLT/HUS, FIN

> Requests the executive office on aging of the department of health to conduct an education and awareness campaign on long term care and have the campaign independently evaluated.

Appropriates funds.

HB3 RELATING TO THE ELDERLY.

HUS/CPC, JUD

Requires a financial institution to report suspected financial abuse against an elder to the appropriate county police department, rather than the department of human services, under certain conditions immediately by telephone and then followed by a written report sent via electronic mail. Repeals the department of human services as the contact agency responsible for determining whether the department has jurisdiction over the elder involved. Requires all financial institutions to develop and implement a training program for their employees regarding the reporting requirements for suspected financial abuse of an elderly.

<u>HB4</u> RELATING TO AGING.

HLT, FIN

Establishes and funds a position for an Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services coordinator within the executive office on aging. Appropriates funds for programs and services that support the State's elderly population, including kupuna care, the aging and disability resource center, senior centers, and the healthy aging partnership program.

HB5 RELATING TO HEALTH.

HLT, FIN

Permits the department of health's emergency medical services and injury prevention system branch to establish and maintain a statewide fall prevention and early detection program and appropriates funds for the program.

HB6 RELATING TO HEALTH.

LAB, FIN

Requires employers to provide a minimum amount of paid sick and safe leave to employees to be used to care for themselves or a family member who is ill, needs medical care, or is a victim of domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking.

HB7 RELATING TO THE ELDERLY.

HLT/HUS, FIN

Creates the Hawaii kupuna trust fund, which comprises public and private funding for meeting the outstanding and future needs of the elderly and dependent adult population.

HB8 RELATING TO LAND USE.

WAL, FIN

Repeals Act 282, Session Laws of Hawaii 2012, which: 1) transferred development rights of certain public lands to the PLDC; 2) exempted certain lands from the definition of public land; 3) created the stadium facilities special fund; and 4) allowed the PLDC to contract with state and county agencies for lease management services for PLDC-controlled land.

<u>HB21</u>	RELATING TO CONDOMINIUMS. Repeals the prioritization of liens for unpaid mortgages over subsequently recorded liens for unpaid condominium association fees. Clarifies the obligations of the acquirer of a foreclosed unit under the lien for unpaid association fees.	CPC, JUD
<u>HB22</u>	RELATING TO PARTITION OF HEIRS PROPERTY. Adopts Uniform Partition of Heirs Property Act. Establishes procedures and remedies for use in actions for partition of real property involving heirs property (real property held in tenancy in common that meets certain requirements).	CPC, JUD
