## Tuesday, February 12, 2013

The Senate of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2013, convened at 11:36 a.m. with the President in the Chair.

The Roll was called showing all Senators present with the exception of Senator Kahele who was excused.

The President announced that she had read and approved the Journal of the Sixteenth Day.

At this time, Senator Taniguchi introduced representatives from the National Conference of State Legislatures including Executive Director Bill Pound and Director of State Services and Hawai'i liaison Corina Eckl.

At this time, Senator Kouchi congratulated the Kapa'a High School boys' soccer team for winning the Division II soccer championship title.

Senator Hee rose to speak on a point of personal privilege as follows:

"I wanted to, by this means, convey some thoughts with regard to where the Committee on Judiciary and Labor is at this point in the session. There evidently is some discussion that the Committee on Judiciary and Labor has been difficult to deal with because bills are not being heard, so I want to offer a few comments in that regard.

"Like every committee chair here, I presume, the buck stops with the committee chair. What's heard, what's not heard, what's recommended to be passed, what's recommended to be deferred, whether indefinitely or not – it really rests with the leadership of the committee. Some of you have asked to hear certain bills, and to the extent possible I have tried to accommodate all of you. But there have been occasions where I may have disagreed with your request or there may have been other issues involved.

"Let me share with you some information. The Committee on Judiciary and Labor was referred 260 bills this session. Other committees have been referred 47, 85, 70, 59, 52, 67 – you get the point. As of February 4th, the Committee on Judiciary and Labor had passed out 25 bills and had heard 57 of the 260 bills – as of February 4th. What about other committees? One committee passed out zero bills as of the 4th; one committee passed out one bill; one committee passed out three bills; one committee passed out four bills; two committees passed out five bills; two committees passed out six bills. I can

tell you as of today, as of today, the Judiciary and Labor Committee has passed out 107 bills for the Senate's consideration. We're not done, but to give you the context of what we've been doing...

"It may be a privilege to say that one committee or another committee is difficult to deal with – you certainly have that privilege – but I would appreciate, as far as the Judiciary and Labor Committee is concerned, if there is an axe to grind or a bone to pick, I'm your huckleberry. Here I am. Not my staff; I'm your huckleberry. So if you folks have any thoughts of aloha you wish to share with me, I sure would be privileged to have those thoughts borne on my shoulders. Thank you."
