

Summary of Testimony Regarding GM586: Supporting the Confirmation of Ms. Jobie Masagatani as Director for the Department of Hawaiian Homelands (DHHL).

Testimony of Colin Kippen.

I am writing in support of the nomination of Ms. Jobie Masagatani to serve as the Director of the DHHL. The testimony I present today is based upon my knowledge of the skills, background, and character of Ms. Masagatani as they relate to her fitness to hold and discharge the responsibilities of this position. Based upon my experience and observations of Ms. Masagatani over the years, I strongly support her confirmation as DHHL Director.

I have known and worked with Ms. Masagatani for over a decade on issues of importance to the Hawaiian people. During the years in which my opinion of her fitness for this position was being formed, I held a number of positions serving Native Hawaiians both here and in Washington D.C. I was the Land Officer and later was promoted to be the Deputy Director in charge of Hawaiian Rights for the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, was appointed as Senior Counsel to the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs under the late Senator Daniel Inouye, was hired as the Executive Director for the Native Hawaiian Education Council, was employed as the Executive Director for the National Indian Education Association (Native Hawaiians are members) in D.C, served as a member and chair of the Native American Grave Protection and Repatriation Act Review Committee (NAGPRA, which by its terms applies to Native Hawaiians) within the Department of Interior, and am presently employed as the Homeless Coordinator for the State of Hawaii.

I first met Ms. Masagatani while employed at the Office of Hawaiian Affairs when she and a group of Hawaiian leaders met to form what would later become the Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement (CNHA), a 501(C)(3) not-for-profit created to educate, inform, and develop programs to increase the knowledge, capacity, and understanding of the Native Hawaiian community as it moved towards increased social, economic, and political self-determination. Many conversations were held and CNHA, under the administrative leadership of Ms. Robin Danner, was eventually created. Over the years CNHA has compiled an impressive record of empowering Hawaiians in an increasing number of programmatic areas, and for setting a standard of excellence for what a Native Hawaiian Community-Based organization can be. I was honored to later become a member of CNHA and to serve on its board of directors.

While at OHA, and again later while working at the Senate Committee on Indian Affairs, I met with Ms. Masagatani on issues having to do with the Native American Housing and Self Determination Act (NAHASDA), the Department of Hawaiian Homelands Trust, and various versions of what is commonly referred to as the Akaka bill. Ms. Masagatani had a reputation of being well-prepared, courteous and professional in her demeanor, and knowledgeable on the issues being discussed. My personal professional experience with her bore this out.

Several years later, while Ms. Masagatani was at the Office of Hawaiian Affairs, we again met and discussed Native Hawaiian Education, the Akaka bill, and the Native Hawaiian Roll which OHA was then in the process of creating. Our conversations were always direct and to the point, and I came to appreciate her forthright manner in collecting information, giving me a sense of what could be accomplished within the OHA structure, and carrying these issues forward within the OHA chain of command. She demonstrated herself to be knowledgeable, trustworthy, and experienced in working with others to accomplish the task at hand.

Ms. Masagatani is presently a designated member of the Hawaii Interagency Council on Homelessness, of which I am the chair. We have spoken on several occasions about the over representation of Native Hawaiians, their families, and children on our homeless rolls, and how this is consistent with the negative social, economic, education, health, and housing statistics with which we in the Hawaiian community are all too familiar. I have been impressed with her understanding of the interrelatedness of these issues, with her understanding of the role that Hawaiian culture, language, and values play in how future programs are created and implemented, and with her understanding that collaborations across agencies and governments are key to reducing homelessness of Hawaiians in their homeland and increasing their overall well-being. Those meetings with Ms. Masagatani paint a compelling picture of her character, her concern for Hawaiians, and her knowledge of the hard work ahead of us that can only be accomplished if we all work together in ways yet to be accomplished.

In sum, my personal experience over the years in working with and around Ms. Masagatani on Hawaiian issues yields but one conclusion: She is well-qualified to lead the DHHL and should be confirmed as its Director.

I am the current Maui District Land Agent for the State Department of Land and Natural Resources, employed in this capacity, for the past 8 years. I also worked 8 years in the Planning Office of the State Department of Hawaiian Home Lands while under the administration of Ms. Masagatani who was at the time serving as the Deputy Director for DHHL under former Chairperson Mr. Raynard Soon. Furthermore, I am a beneficiary of the Hawaiian home lands trust, and since 2005, I have served as vice president of the Waiehu Kou Phase 3 Association, Inc. (WK3), a domestic non-profit corporation registered in the State of Hawaii, which is administered by a duly elected Board of Directors which represents 114 Hawaiian Homestead households at Kou, Waiehu, Maui.

Pursuant to my many years of dealing with State government, and the Hawaiian home lands program, both as an employee of DHHL and as a trust beneficiary, it has been my experience that Ms. Masagatani has the necessary competence and passion to guide the Hawaiian home lands program toward its goal of rehabilitation for native Hawaiians. I have observed Ms. Masagatani's ability to work efficiently and effectively to address complex issues relative to improving the socio-economic conditions of native Hawaiians. Through the application of good listening skills, strong leadership characteristics expressed in her confidence in speech and knowledge of relative policies and procedures, Ms. Masagatani is able to reach resolution via the application of necessary logic and reason in situations that seem to be mired in chaos.

Over the past 3 years, the DHHL program has suffered from a high turn-over rate of Chairpersons. It is my belief that this high turn-over rate has resulted in low productivity at DHHL because of a lack of leadership. I am Darrell Yagodich, a native Hawaiian Waiohuli Undivided Interest lessee and an employee at DHHL the past 33 years. I have served under nine Chairpersons from 1979 to the present as the Hawaiian home lands trust has evolved and grown significantly.

Hawaiian home lands is a trust and the Chairman, like other Commissioners, has certain fiduciary duties. These include following the trust document, the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, making trust property productive, looking after the interests of all beneficiaries (lessees, applicants, others), considering the long term interests of a perpetual trust, and duty of loyalty to the beneficiaries.

There are other challenges facing the trust at this period in its history. We are facing a "fiscal cliff" of our own with the end of Act 14 payments in two years and the constant pressure to cut our federal housing funds. The following is some of the incidents I want to share with you that leads me to write this letter of opposition to confirm nominee to Chair DHHL.

- Nominee demonstrated bias treatment toward beneficiary organizations
 - Waimea Hawaiian Homestead Association, Hawaii Island: Community Development project met resistance from DHHL staff and nominee. When challenged, both DHHL and nominee yielded to project.
 - Nanakuli, O'ahu: license held up because of unsubstantiated challenges that divided homestead community with no resolve and when challenged, both DHHL and nominee yielded to the approved project.
 - o Anahola, Kaua'i:
 - Solar project: license stalled at AG office with no follow-up because the DHHL failed to keep agriculture lands in production when it was returned from a non-Hawaiian general lease and after the Hawaiian Homestead Community Association worked hard and invested to sign the partners in this venture to make it a reality.
 - DHHL recommended to Commissioners to assume the project and almost stole the project from the homestead community through HCDC.
- Nominee's willingness to work against homestead beneficiaries and organizations is alarming to me as a Commissioner.
- Four commissioners oppose the Governor's nominee solidly. While two more are undecided on how to address the obvious conflict.
- No discussion on revenue generation projects for Department from the nominee while attempts to disapprove beneficiary driven projects that was worked on for years.
- Other projects on hold:

- Geothermal Big island & Maui only addressing the Ad Hoc Policy Committee recommendations recently after my assertiveness and support from other commissioners and beneficiaries. Many opportunities await these policies for transparency, equality and compliance with the HHCA, as amended 1921, to "Rehabilitate native Hawaiians and to return native Hawaiians back to their ancestral lands.
- Game management also unfinished business that Commissioners want to address.
- Mauna Kea access also unfinished business that Commissioners want to address.
- Prison also unfinished business that Commissioners want to address.
- Waste-energy partnerships also unfinished business that Commissioners want to address.

Thank you very much for your attention to this very important decision you will make for the betterment of native Hawaiians as defined and expressed in the Hawaiian Home Commission Act 1920, as amended 1921, the State of Hawaii Admission Act, and codified in the Hawaii Revised Statues.

Dear Senate President Kim and Members of the Senate,

I am writing in support of the nomination of Jobie Masagatani for Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission for four reasons: her leadership, creativity, financial expertise, and willingness to put principles before politics. My name is Douglas Bigley and I am the President of Urban Housing Communities, the Co-developer and guarantor of Hale Makana O Nanakuli.

I first met Jobie when she was at the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. At that time, among other things, she was pursuing the development of CDFI's (Community Development Financial Institutions). I have always been impressed with her creativity and financial expertise. It has been my work, however, at Hale Makana O Nanakuli after Jobie was appointed Chairperson designate for the Hawaiian Homes Commission that has put me in a unique position to comment on her qualifications.

To be sure, Jobie was tough on us, and we did not have a full appreciation of how complex her position was. While she always understood the benefits of the Hale Makana O Nanakuli development to the Nanakuli community, she was also aware of large numbers within the Nanakuli community who felt disenfranchised. It was a very emotional situation for the Native Hawaiian Community. It would be difficult for anyone to navigate under these circumstances, and Jobie was new to her position. Jobie was trying to find a balance between what appears, at first, to be competing agendas. On the one hand, she was trying to find innovative ways to finance the development of much needed affordable housing on Native Hawaiian homeland that did not always allow for a deed restriction. On the other hand, she was trying to protect the use of the housing for Native Hawaiians.

Jobie stopped the closing of Hale Makana O Nanakuli development. I did not know it was temporary and this has never happen to me in 20 years in this business. In doing so, to unify the Nanakuli community, Jobie took great political risk by putting principles ahead of the politics. She wanted to satisfy herself that everything was being done that could be done under the existing financial structure to protect Native Hawaiian Homeland. She

understood that she had certain obligations to close a deal that had long since been approved, but she also made it clear to me that she wanted two things.

Number one; she wanted me to meet with those in the Nanakuli community that felt disenfranchised. She let me know that the meeting would be tough, but fair. She wanted me to establish my credibility by being available and open. Number two; she wanted me to revisit my funding sources to see if there were ways within permissible guidelines to help insure that the Native Hawaiians living in Nanakuli would have a high probability of living in the new development. She was most interested in the RDA marketing plan that allowed for affirmative marketing to the surrounding community. She asked if we were doing enough. Upon our review, we agreed that we could do more. Jobie let me know if I did these things she would move the project forward. Subsequently, I demonstrated to her that we had done what she asked and, accordingly, she closed the funding. Her skillful handling of this challenging situation revealed to me her capacity as a leader, her command of the issues, and the enormous talent that she brings to the agency.

While the road going forward will not always be easy, Jobie possesses the knowledge and commitment to use her tremendous skills to assist the organization in meeting its most important mandate, to provide housing for the Native Hawaiians. Given that Jobie, in her short tenure, has already demonstrated to me what she is capable of doing, I support her confirmation for Chairperson of the Hawaiian Homes Commission.

Aloha Chairman Galuteria, Vice Chair Keith-Agaran and members of the Committee. I am Annelle Amaral, First Vice President of the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs(AHCC) here today to offer some recommendations with regard to Governor's Message 586.

Fully aware that the original Hawaiian Civic Club was founded in 1918 by Prince Kuhio and his cohorts to assist with the passage of the Hawaiian Homes Act in the US Congress, the Board of Directors of the AHCC, meeting on January 19, 2013, has chosen not to support, nor oppose, the Governor's nominee for Director of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands.

Some of our members are homesteaders, and we have been made aware that currently there is bitter disagreement among homesteaders, as well as those on the HHL waiting list, with regard to the nomination of Jobie Masagatani as the Director of HHL. However, since the majority of our members are not homesteaders, the AHCC Board decided that it is not our *kuleana* to take a position on an issue that affects something as basic...as essential, as the shelter of a family home and the land around it.

We are, therefore, submitting a general statement of qualifications that we believe describe standards of leadership basic to any administrator or executive officer of a major Hawaiian or Native Hawaiian organization...in this case, the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands.

We understand that academic background, experience and good judgment are of primary importance in leadership, but in addition, we would ask you to consider other, very fundamental Hawaiian behavior.

We submit that leaders of Hawaiian organizations should include certain core values to:

- *malama*, care for, understand and support the people, especially the kupuna;
- ho`oihi, respect the views of all;
- *kuleana*, take responsibility for self, family and community;
- `ike, seek knowledge, be informed to enable good decisions;
- *na`au pono*, nurture a deep sense of justice and seek to remedy the conditions of the people in the kuleana;
- laulima, work cooperatively with many hands;
- lokahi, seek harmony, balance and unity;
- *ha`aha`a*, serve with humility.

Incorporating these life values will raise the level of leadership and better the conditions of Hawaiians and let our heritage thrive in an atmosphere of goodwill and cooperation. Thank you for the opportunity to testify.

Aloha 'auinalā kākou,

Chair Galuteria, Vice-Chair Keith-Agaran and Members of the Committee, thank you for this opportunity to testify in support of my nomination as Chairperson of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands. It is truly my honor and privilege to be before you today as you consider my confirmation to this position.

Allow me this chance to share with you briefly my educational and professional background and experiences, and what I hope to focus on if given the opportunity to lead the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL) through the challenging times that lay ahead.

After graduating from the Kamehameha Schools with Honors in 1982, I went on to obtain my Bachelor of Science Degree in Education in June 1986 from Northwestern University: School of Education in Evanston, Illinois, and three years later, my Masters Degree in Public Affairs / Urban and Regional Planning in June 1989 from Princeton University: Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs in Princeton, New Jersey.

Upon completing my formal education, I held a number of jobs with progressively increasing responsibilities over the years, starting out as a Budget Examiner, Office of Management and Budget, Executive Office of the President (from 8/1989 - 10/1990), to Land Investment Analyst, Kamehameha Schools Bishop Estate (11/1990 - 5/1993), to Project Manager, Hawaii Real Estate Research and Education Center – Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii (5/1993 - 1/1995), to Deputy to the Chairman, Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (2/1995 - 11/2002), then to Assistant to the President and CEO, The Queen's Health Systems, (12/2002 - 6/2005).

Following my tenure at the Queen's Health Systems, I left to become Principal and Founder, Clarity Organizational Services (7/2005 - 2/2010). I returned back to public service to our Native Hawaiian people in 2010, when I was hired as Public Policy Program Manager, Office of Hawaiian Affairs (2/2010 - 8/2011) and advanced to Special Assistant to the CEO,

Office of Hawaiian Affairs (8/2011 - 5/2012) before finally coming full circle as Chairman Designate, Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (5/2012 - Present).

I also have experience in the Hawaiian and business communities through my affiliation as a member of: Queen Lili'uokalani Trust Trustee Compensation Committee, the Hui Hanai Board (Queen Lili'uokalani Children's Center), the Native Hawaiian Education Council (OHA's Representative), the Kamehameha Schools Board of Advisors, the John A. Burns School of Medicine Department of Native Hawaiian Health Community Advisory Board, the U.S. Census Advisory Committee on the Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islanders Population, and the Affordable Housing Advisory Council Federal Home Loan Bank of Seattle. Through my education and experience I have gained expertise, skills, and wisdom that I bring to the position of Chairperson if given the opportunity to lead DHHL and the trust that it administers.

Over 90 years ago, Congress enacted the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act. The results of that legislation, the public land trust called Hawaiian Home Lands and the programs administered by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands on behalf of the native Hawaiian beneficiaries of this trust, endure today as a significant tool to support and sustain the native Hawaiian people.

I initially submitted my name to the Governor for consideration in this position because I believe in the potential of this land trust, I believe in the opportunity it can create for native Hawaiian families and homestead communities, and I take to heart the kuleana to manage the trust effectively in the best interest of all beneficiaries – the nearly 10,000 on the land, the 26,000 plus still waiting and those yet to come.

I was humbled by Governor Abercrombie's selection of me to be the Chairperson Designate of the Department back in May 2012, and while the job has been difficult, I take the responsibilities that come with this position and the accountability I have to all of the beneficiaries of this trust very seriously, and I am committed to give nothing less than my very best everyday.

Fortunately, the experience I gained as a former DHHL Deputy to the Chairman for 7 years, provided me with an acute understanding of the department, its funding and operations, the complex issues surrounding balancing beneficiary obligations – both to those who have leases with the department and those still on the wait list, and the impacts of recent court cases that will affect how the department is currently funded and how it will be funded in future years.

Since coming back to DHHL, the past eight months have been a whirlwind of activity and change.

Certain things have remained the same:

o It is still the mission of DHHL to manage the Hawaiian Home Lands Trust effectively and to develop and deliver land to native Hawaiians.

- We do this by partnering with others to work towards developing healthy selfsufficient communities.
- We have a small, overworked, dedicated, and loyal staff (some who have been with the Department for three to four decades) that put in long hours to address the needs and concerns of the beneficiaries and care a great deal about moving the DHHL mission forward.

And at the same time, certain things have changed and are different.

- Our staffing numbers have remained the same or have diminished, while homestead applications, leases and loans have increased dramatically over time.
- With uncertain economic times, we are finding we need to do more to ensure that potential beneficiaries are financially ready to accept and maintain their lease award to include "homeownership" and home budgeting education. In addition, we are working with our for-profit and non-profit development and lending partners to continue to offer housing stock at affordable prices to our beneficiaries.
- Our financial resources going forward are uncertain with the end of the Act 14 land settlement payments expected in 2015.
- o And finally, as we develop more homesteads, balancing the trusts limited resources between those who have leases and are in need of resources to bring to reality their community's vision, and those waiting to be awarded a lease is an increasingly challenging task.

If I am fortunate enough to be confirmed by this illustrious body I hope to address those concerns in the following manner:

First, we need to **stabilize our financial future**. We will strive to accomplish this by helping to raise awareness of the impact the Nelson decision has with regard to the constitutional obligation to provide "sufficient sum" to administer and operate our State department, increasing the performance of trust assets (both financial and real property), addressing the risk associated with our expanding loan portfolio, reducing fixed costs, and partnering with Federal and private resources whenever possible.

Over the past 6 weeks, we have personally visited with beneficiary community leaders in meetings held in Waimanalo, Maui, Kona, Hilo, Molokai, and Kapolei to discuss the Nelson case and how it impacts our budget submittal this year. The response has been overwhelmingly supportive with nearly 100 leaders volunteering to partner with and assist the Department in getting the message across on the need for general fund allocations for the operations of DHHL.

In addition, in the past eight months DHHL has broken ground on three projects: Lalamilo on Hawaii Island (83 lots); Piilani Mai Ke Kai on Kauai (51 lots); and Kakaina on GM586 Testimony of Jobie Masagatani Page 4

Oahu in Waimanalo (44 lots). The first project Lalamilo, through a partnership with Sandwich Isle Communication (SIC) financed the infrastructure (roads, lot grading, water, sewer, and telecommunication) with combined private and DHHL trust dollars together. The last two projects, Piilani Mai Ke Kai and Kakaina added a third partner and financed the infrastructure using U.S. Department of Agriculture Rural Development (USDA RD) federal dollars, private (SIC), and DHHL Trust dollars.

Second, we will **address product affordability** through creative financing programs through NAHASDA funds, reestablishing financial literacy and homeownership readiness programs (through partnerships), revisiting "old" ideas (e.g., owner-builder, self-help, and Habitat for Humanity partnerships), and exploring new ideas (e.g., financing products with OHA, deferred-purchase projects, and other innovative ideas).

In fact, during our beneficiary outreach meetings, some of our beneficiary leaders have also stimulated our thinking for "outside the box" solutions that need to be examined further for feasibility and validity in more rural communities. Their suggestion that the Department partner with local vendors that supply housing kits and look at off-grid solutions such as water catchment systems to reduce cost is something we need to vet seriously to see how it can be implemented effectively and efficiently in those rural communities where it may make sense.

Third, we will **re-assess our agriculture program** by establishing partnerships with the Department of Agriculture, restoring technical assistance contracted services, determining how best to address existing non-compliance, and how to support new awards.

Toward that end, the Department is in the process of lifting its more than a decade old moratorium on agricultural and pastoral lot subdivision following the development of an implementation plan and approval of this plan by the Commission. When we do so, we will do it with the input of our beneficiaries so that those who want to subdivide will be allowed to do so within reason and those that want to continue to farm and raise livestock will be able to do so without urbanization encroaching on their country way of life.

Fourth, we will **maximize our management of our natural resources** by reviewing our existing energy policy and adopting a new water policy for the Department.

My staff has been on Maui holding meetings with our beneficiary organizations there to position our lands in Kahikinui, Pulehunui and Honokowai so that we will be prepared with a competitive proposal when MECO issues its RFP for Alternate Energy providers. This is to improve DHHL's revenue stream to enhance the resources available to place more native Hawaiians on the land and fund other programs or projects that benefit beneficiaries.

We will also be conducting a round of beneficiary consultations on every island open to all beneficiaries to seek their input into DHHL's revised Energy Policy and Water Policy. These meetings are tentatively scheduled to occur in the spring and summer of 2013.

Finally, we will **support community-based projects** to the greatest extent possible, within the limitations of our finances by partnering with others to support capacity building, training, and other technical assistance for community leaders; and determining how to best support beneficiary based organizations in moving their community development projects forward to the next level.

In closing, I have learned that challenges are not necessarily a bad thing. Sometimes these challenges help to bring a new set of eyes, a different perspective, or perhaps a new solution to an age old problem.

Although the road leading to today has not been smooth sailing, I am honored by the many different beneficiary, Native Hawaiian, and other organizations who have come out to support DHHL in meeting its ambitious mission and I look forward to working with many of them collaboratively in moving this mission forward.

I am also genuinely touched knowing that I have a supportive and dedicated staff, many of whom have joined us today, who remain committed to doing good work though that work often goes unrecognized. The staff are the heart that pumps away daily and keeps DHHL's mission and its programs moving forward.

Finally, I would be remiss if I did not recognize my biggest source of inspiration and support, my family. As a single parent raising two children, I am blessed to have supportive parents who helped establish in me a firm foundation of faith, compassion, integrity, and excellence. These very values are what drive me to do the best that I can in the time that I have as Chairperson to build a stronger trust, a stronger department, and stronger beneficiary organizations and leaders that will help take our people to a higher level of empowerment and self-determination.

As a commissioner serving on the Hawaiian Homes Commission, I submit this letter to share my concern about the confirmation of the interim Director and Chair Designate, Jobie Masagatani. My concern and lack of confidence in the interim Director is based on three primary observations. First, she demonstrates a lack of willingness to partner with beneficiary organizations. Second, she has allowed informal opinions of the attorney general to stifle the decision-making authority of the commission. Third, she works to minimize our input and prevents rather than facilitates our obligation to make decisions as the governing body.

The interim director has demonstrated on several occasions that she can and will create unnecessary roadblocks for some organizations and not for others. Her bias is very clear for anyone to see, and is an abuse of the office of the Chair.

As a commissioner, it has been impossible to get action items on the agenda for proper votes. The interim director has allowed, and even encouraged, the Deputy Attorney General to run the Commission, diminishing the authority of the Commission as the governing body of the Hawaiian Home Land trust created by Congress.

Finally, the interim director continues to disregard my input and that of other commissioners, attempting to prevent our contributions to commission discussions. In fact, she has specifically chastised me, calling my input in commission meetings "drama". Her demeanor and reference to my input is simply disrespectful and unacceptable as the Chair toward me as Kupuna, but also to me as a fellow commissioner.

Senators, I have a long history with Hawaiian Homes, born and raised on the first increment of the Waimanalo Homestead, an advocate for beneficiaries since the early 1970s with the organization The Hawaiians, a member of the Piianaia family which had two family members; namely Abraham and his daughter Ilima both being past directors and presently a resident of the only senior housing project in the Homestead.

The leadership style I have witnessed is destructive and disrespectful of the beneficiaries we serve. I have first-hand experience with the interim director over the last many months, and as such, I submit to you my vote of no confidence in this nominee.


I am a civil service planner V who has worked in the Planning Office at the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands for 7 years, during which time I have served under four (4) chairmen. I took time off of work today to <u>support</u> the confirmation of Ms. Jobie Masagatani as the Chairman of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands.

As a Hawaiian planner, I appreciate that Ms. Masagatani has her Master's degree in Public Affairs/Urban and Regional Planning from Princeton University. In her 9 months working as our interim Chairman, her methodical approach, future orientation, and insistence on proper beneficiary consultation are principles that are embedded in our planning practice. Further, in order to ensure informed engagement of our Hawaiian Homes Commissioners, she has asked staff to conduct 2 or 3 educational workshops at each Commission meeting, especially on complex topics. She schedules the educational workshop and in the following commission meeting, brings the related proposed action for decision-making. As a result of her leadership, this Commission speaks on-point, they ask germane questions, and they engage in deliberation that is meaningful and informed.

Her stated priorities are also indicative of a necessary future orientation that I believe all Hawaiian Home Lands chairmen should possess. She is tackling our fiscal situation, first and foremost, but is also taking on big ticket issues involving our energy policy, our water policy, and our agricultural and pastoral program, which has not been touched in the last 20 years. Development of these policies and programs lay a fundamental foundation for future homestead development. They involve wicked and complex issues that 6 previous Chairman chose to avoid. With courage, she understands that these program and policy areas can no longer be handled cosmetically, but must be fully researched, carefully developed, and taken out for full discussion in our beneficiary community. They are critical to the future viability of the trust.

Beyond these key distinctions that already warrant support of Ms. Masagatani, I am most impressed with Ms. Masagatani's eloquent, yet unwavering resolve to fight for our native Hawaiian beneficiaries and the resources of our trust lands. I have seen too many chairmen shy away from other powers-that-be often settling for less than our due share. Ms. Masagatani is not afraid to meet face-to-face with other powers that have competing jurisdictions. And unlike other chairmen, Ms Masagatani speaks with eloquence, knowledge, and fortitude. She organizes her thoughts and is able to cover both the waterfront and nuances of complex issues. Her fortitude and resolve in securing what the trust deserves is refreshing and inspiring to me as a civil service employee of the Department, as a professional planner, and as a Hawaiian that might someday be a beneficiary of this important trust.

No other confirmation has moved me to speak. There have been a lot of negative hype surrounding this confirmation—but you need to know that she was not given the common courtesy afforded to all other Chairmen—she was not given the opportunity to meet with or talk to her detractors. She was judged before a fair hearing, so to speak. From my vantage point, as a Hawaiian working in the Department, I see that Ms. Masagatani has the mind-set and courage of leadership that we so desperately need, especially in these difficult times. This testimony is offered on behalf of the Board of Directors of Hui Kako'o 'Aina Ho'opulapula, who at a duly held meeting voted to oppose the appointment of Jobje Masagatani for the position of Director of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands offered by Governor Abercrombie in GM 586.

Hui Kako'o 'Aina Ho'opulapula (hereinafter "Hui Kako'o") is a non-profit organization (incorporated in 1994) which advocates for the interests of native Hawaiians who have applied for homestead leases from the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands but who have not yet received a lease, commonly referred to as the "Waitlisters". We have for many years looked to the interests of this class of beneficiaries and have had the opportunity to work with many other beneficiary groups including the homesteaders, many Directors and staff, both former and present, of the Department.

We first became acquainted with Ms. Masagatani when she worked as Deputy Director for the Department. At that time the Board was deliberating on whether or not to intervene in the lawsuit <u>Arakaki vs Cayetano</u>, a suit which threatened to impact the Hawaiian Home Lands trust. In her capacity as Deputy Director she approached the Board and ask that we refrain from intervening because another beneficiary organization, which represented the interests of the homesteaders, was intervening in the suit. This request struck us as unorthodox and unethical demonstrating that the

interests of the Waitlisters were not a consideration for that Administration. The Board did intervene in that suit.

Most recently since the interim appointment of Ms. Masagatani as Director, we have attend monthly Commission meetings and Department functions offered to beneficiary organizations. Ms. Masagatani is astute, comports herself with dignity and presides over the Commission meeting with an even hand respectful of the beneficiaries who come to testify before the Commission. However, we noted that at recent Commission meetings the Deputy Director has been excluded from the Commission's Executive Session. Hui Kako'o believes the duties of the Deputy Director require that he/she be included in the deliberative sessions of the Commission so that the Deputy can be informed on all matters affecting the Department and the interests of the beneficiaries. If anything happened to the Director the Deputy Director could continue the work of the Department without interruption. As beneficiaries we want to know that our trust administrators are informed and can carry on.

On another note, we believe Ms. Masagatani during her interim appointment has taken certain positions on matters which benefit the trust but which do not please influential persons. We applaud her willingness to stand for the greater good of the trust.

Taking all matters and experiences into account, on the whole we believe we must oppose this appointment.

Aloha Chair Galuteria, Vice-Chair Keith-Agaran, and Members of the THA Committee:

Kekaha Hawaiian Homestead Association (KHHA) strongly supports the Governor's nomination of Jobie Masagatani for Chair of the Hawaiian Homes Commission.

As a Chair, Ms. Masagatani is excellent in her ability to keep Commission discussions focused while also encouraging feedback by Commissioners and native Hawaiian beneficiaries. She has brought an extremely high level of executive ability and mature, deliberative approaches to the Commission.

With this, we feel that DHHL and the Commission under Chair Masagatani's leadership gives native Hawaiians the best chance to finally experience the benefits of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act in fair and equitable ways that respect local self governance protocols and intelligently build value for Hawaiian home lands.

We have witnessed Chair Masagatani's thoughtful assessments of policy questions presented to her, as well as her commitment to creating order and formal criteria through which all Hawaiian Homes projects can be assessed.

Masagatani has already achieved much in her tenure. For example, in her first months in office, she spearheaded and completed statewide studies and policy analyses so that the Hawaiian Homes Commissioners and the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands staff can finally make informed, consistent decisions regarding Hawaiian home lands. Prior to this, decisions by these agencies were often made haphazardly, on a "one by one" basis.

Masagatani's has also acted effectively to (i) build capacity of Hawaiian community based leaders, including supporting gatherings by the SCHHA and CNHA, (ii) create opportunities that will result in up to \$15 million to DHHL in USDA Rural Development support, (iii) establish collaborative discussions with other state and Federal agencies, and (iv) significantly increase the capacity of Hawaiian Homes Commissioners through workshops on issues such as land use and institutional responsibilities.

In achieving all this within less than 8 months, Ms. Masagatani has brought a hopeful vibrance to the Hawaiian Homes Commission that is exciting to Hawaiian beneficiaries and applicants.

We urge THA Committee members and Senators <u>not to politicize this nomination</u>, but instead confirm Ms. Masagatani as a truly capable, thoughtful leader – She is exactly the kind of leader that can lead the home lands through times of great transition for the home lands and for the Hawaiian people.

We ask that the Senate and Senate Committee not bow to politicking, and understand that Chair-designate Masagatani is receiving criticism from those who are frustrated by Ms. Masagatani's refusal to make uninformed, legally questionable decisions regarding the use and management of Hawaiian home lands. Legal analysis from the Hawaii State Attorney General's office supports Ms. Masagatani's and the Hawaiian Homes Commission actions.

Examination of the public record and HHC meeting minutes shows that many of the assertions and descriptions of Ms. Masagatani's actions by Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement and the Sovereign Councils of Hawaiian Homelands Assembly (SCHHA) are both mischaracterized and unfounded. While these organizations provide some important services to our communities, their stance on this issue, as well as their chosen process and public statements describing the breadth of their representation of native Hawaiians are problematic.

Ms. Masagatani is professional, abides by the law in terms of agency budgeting practices and Federal/State discussion protocols, and is driven by overarching policy goals-- not by political pressure. She is building for DHHL and Hawaiian home lands new sources of support and professional networks for the home lands in her short tenure.

What is most important is that, by her actions and her conduct of Commission meetings, we know that she cares deeply about the longterm future of the Hawaiian people.

As a final administrative note, KHHA had requested but never received the official wording of SCHHA's formal resolution regarding its stance on Ms. Masagatani, though we were told that the final text would be shared with all SCHHA members prior to being approved by SCHHA's Executive Council. This is a critical concern, since SCHHA members had voted overwhelmingly at SCHHA's plenary meeting to afford Ms. Masagatani a chance to respond to SCHHA's criticisms and *ho'oponopono* with SCHHA before any official proclamation was to be made. Final text or results of such a *ho'oponopono* process were never shared with the SCHHA membership roster.

KHHA applauds the Chair-designate for her high level of professionalism and *pono* approach to her work. She is the kind of above-board, professional and educated leader that we as native Hawaiians have needed for so long. Please confirm Ms. Masagatani.

This testimony is submitted, in my personal capacity, in OPPOSITION to GM 586 for consideration and confirmation to the Chairperson of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL), Gubernatorial Nominee, Jobie Masagatani.

Since appointment in May 2012, I have witnessed first-hand cruel and paternal actions by DHHL staff and Interim Director Masagatani, against one of the most progressive nonprofits in the state, the Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement (CNHA). I am able to witness activities first-hand in my professional capacity as the Vice President of CNHA overseeing the Community Development programming, and personally, as a Hawaiian homesteader for most of my life. I was raised on homesteads on Hawaii Island, and I am now raising my own children on homesteads in Papakolea.

My position to OPPOSE is based on the last eight months, wherein Interim Director Masagatani delayed contract execution, delayed invoice payment, terminated a successful affordable housing contract, and/or simply failed to take action. There are incidents were the Interim Director approached our project partners, and strongly advocated for termination of their partnership with CNHA and its nonprofit development arm, Homestead Community Development Corporation. The direct impact of these actions has threatened project financing, loss of revenue generating opportunities for the Hawaiian Home Lands Trust, and even jeopardized grant funds to projects. These examples are very real, and very painful to witness first-hand, not only to me, but to our staff that are so dedicated to Hawaii and our Hawaiian people. Over the last 12 years, CNHA has shown an incredible commitment to leveraging DHHL resources, which brings in non-state funding to advance the Hawaiian homes program.

We are at critical time in the homestead community, where leadership, innovation, and collaboration are needed to provide much needed services to all beneficiaries of the Hawaiian Home Lands Trust. The fiscal condition of the State, as well as the depleting Trust account balances of the Hawaiian Homes Commission requires good leadership at DHHL to get lands to the 30,000 beneficiaries on the waitlist. The Interim Director's track record over the last eight months does not demonstrate leadership, innovation or collaboration, and therefore I cannot support her confirmation.

I thank Chair Galuteria, Vice Chair Keith-Agaran and Committee Members for the opportunity to submit testimony. Aloha.

Aloha Chair Galuteria and Members of the Hawaiian Affairs Committee,

I submit my testimony in opposition to the confirmation of Interim Director, Jobie Masagatani.

I am Hawaiian and a Kaupe'a homesteader where my husband and I raise our 12 year old son. I am a graduate of Kamehameha and have been actively engaged in homestead community development work for the last 10 years. My career has been focused on lending, providing access to capital for trust land communities and Native Hawaiian policy advocacy. I have worked with business executives and government officials at the Federal, State, and County level. I was the Executive Director at Hawaiian Community Assets for 6 years where I worked alongside DHHL by assisting beneficiaries to achieve and sustain homeownership. I have served on multiple national boards, local non-profit boards, served my community association and have 20 years of management experience in both the private and non-profit sectors. Most recently, I served as the Deputy Director to Interim Director Masagatani, appointed by Governor Neil Abercrombie.

In the last 25 years of my career I have never experienced a more hostile work environment than the one created by the lack of communication and indecisive leadership provided at DHHL by Interim Director Masagatani.

Under Jobie's directorship at DHHL I was continuously confronted with intimidating and unacceptable circumstances. Circumstances I deemed as inappropriate at any level of state government. Namely, as a beneficiary of the trust, my personal beneficiary file went missing from DHHL's records. I wrote to Jobie about my concern with no response to date. In a separate instance, an investigation of DHHL was conducted by the State Attorney General's office wherein I requested information and representation on issues that were pertinent to me. To date, I received no explanation or sufficient response to my inquiry.

I was dismissed by Interim Director Masagatani on December 12, 2012 after being asked by Bruce Coppa, Governor Abercrombie's Chief of Staff, to take a position as the deputy at another state agency to be funded by the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands. I declined to step down as the DHHL Deputy without a discussion with the Governor. Furthermore, I refused to accept a salary to be funded by our trust dollars for me to continue my employment with the state at another agency. Three business days later, I was dismissed by Interim Director Masagatani who claimed she was no longer in need of my services.

When I met with Mr. Coppa prior to being dismissed, I was advised by State Attorney General, David Louie that investigations did take place at DHHL that revealed I had expressed an opinion that was not in

line with me continuing on as the Deputy at DHHL. However, he said that if I accepted the position at a different agency of the state, the investigation would be "less manifest". Ms. Masagatani was fully aware of the situation. She had met with Mr. Coppa prior to my meeting and agreed to have DHHL fund my salary at an alternate state agency.

Jobie is a sophisticated bureaucrat who serves the interests of the State very well. However, she consistently struggles when faced with challenges that arise between her duties as a state director and her responsibility as a commissioner under the fiduciary duties of the Hawaiian Home Lands trust to its beneficiaries. Over the last 8 months Jobie has heavily relied on legal opinions of the State Attorney General's office despite the clear purpose and intent of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act. Her leadership makes it difficult to continue towards a path of beneficiary empowerment and self determination for homestead communities.

Senators, our trust deserves better. Our people deserve better. As the former Deputy appointed by the Honorable Governor Neil Abercrombie, I deserved better. I am only guilty of dedicating my time at DHHL to beneficiary advocacy and empowerment and for that I was dismissed.

The beneficiaries of the Hawaiian Home Lands Trust deserve a leader who is able to balance the reality of both hats they are required to wear. Interim Director Masagatani has proven to be a bureaucrat over a beneficiary trustee and advocate, and worse, she has worked to minimize the ability of other commissioners to fulfill their duties as trustees. Her leadership style has created division versus fostering partnerships. As difficult as it is to publicly voice my concerns, I testify in opposition to the confirmation of Jobie Masagatani.

Honorable Senators,

I am happy to submit this testimony in support of the confirmation of Jobie Masagatani, to continue as Chair of the Department of Hawaiian Homelands.

The appointment of Ms. Masagatani to fill the vacancy left by the departure of Alapaki Nahale'a has moved the DHHL forward and had a significant impact on relieving the back log of projects and decision making which Mr. Nahalea's administration was ill prepared to address. During her short term as DHHL Director, Ms. Masagatani has accomplished several achievements, including:

- 1. Groundbreaking for 3 projects.
 - a. June Waimanalo, Oahu 45 lots
 - b. September Anahola, Kauai 51 lots
 - c. October Waimea, Hawaii Island 83 lots

The first two projects are utilizing USDA-RD monies and a public-private partnership model. These projects had languished for months, but are now moving forward as a result of Jobie's leadership.

2. General leases - Hawaiian Homes Commission approved an authorization for direct negotiations for proposals for renewable energy development on the island of Maui. This is the most significant accomplishment of Chair Masagatani. For months, Hawaii Energy Producers had been approaching the DHHL to discuss energy and how it could be developed on DHHL lands in order to bring in badly needed revenues. Under the previous administration, a geothermal energy committee was created to "vet" the issue, all this Committee could do was talk to energy producers, it had no authority to recommend action to the Commission & in fact, following the "vetting" exercise, it ceased to exist! For months, Wind, Solar, & Geothermal producers had been approaching the DHHL without being able to propose projects to the Department. This stalemate occurred because Mr.

Nahale'a was trying to funnel all economic development opportunities to his friend Robin Danner & her group despite the fact that Danner was not an "energy producer" and lacked the ability & expertise to develop energy. It was not until January 2013 that the DHHL Commission, under the leadership of Masagatani, finally gave approval for the Department to utilize applicable HRS provisions to begin "Direct Negotiation" for energy production on DHHL lands.

3. Capacity-building for homestead community-based organizations:

- a. June 27, 2012 DHHL training conference for community based leaders (at no cost to leaders) in collaboration with Hawaii Alliance for Community Based Economic Development organization;
- b. Provided funding to SCHHA for conference held in August 2012 (approved but not funded in 2011-2012 budget). Funded out of 2012-2013 budget;
- c. September 30 DHHL training conference for community based leaders (at no cost to leaders) in collaboration with Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement.

4. Spend down of Federal monies:

- a. Addressed logjam within DHHL to move on applications for USDA-RD monies set-aside for water projects on DHHL lands (\$15 million total). First application for DHHL submitted October 2012. Two additional applications are in progress.
- b. Hired a manager for the Native American Housing and Self-Determination Act (NAHASDA) program; position was vacant since September 2011;
- c. Currently developing a six-month spend down plan for unspent NAHASDA balances.

5. Operations:

- a. Two Executive session briefings for Commission on duties and responsibilities by Attorney General's office
- b. First ever full day workshop for Commission on DHHL Capital Improvements Budget (\$50 Million) conducted in public
- c. Comprehensive workshop for Commission on Operating Budget (could not be done in public based on advice of counsel due to Nelson litigation),
- d. Established monthly meeting/conference call schedule with U.S. Department of the Interior officials to clarify oversight relationship and streamline approvals for land exchanges,
- e. January statewide outreach to homestead association/beneficiary organization leaders on the Nelson case and the DHHL budget request for FY 2014-2015.

During her short term in office, Ms. Masagatani has increased staff morale & returned the Department to a sense of purpose and direction. This effort has met with resistance from some of the DHHL Commissioners who support the Danner group & their exclusive effort to garner all benefits for themselves and a few beneficiaries to the exclusion of the

vast number of lessees and waiting list Hawaiians. A clear example of this bias can be seen by reviewing the project proposed by Danner for development of energy at Anahola, Kauai. In that case, Ms. Danner somehow acquired the development rights for a 55-acre project from the DHHL. She then attempted to broker a deal in behalf of KIUC, the Kauai Utility Company. The terms of the Danner deal violated state law and were a breach of trust. Under the Danner deal, DHHL did not get rent based on the value of energy, but was to receive rent based on agricultural uses. In addition, Danner allocated 20% of rental due to DHHL to herself & her organizations! She built in a 1-time payment for her brokerage fees at \$750,000.00! Under the Danner deal, an estimated 12 million dollars in New Market Tax Credits were allocated to build a new office complex for KIUC's corporate offices! Most significantly, the administration of Mr. Nahale'a had waived the Departments due diligence review of the Danner deal. The record reflects that the DHHL Commissioners approved the Danner deal without a review of any independent assessment or due diligence. This egregious situation would have continued had it not been for the appointment of Jobie Masagatani. Since Ms. Masagatani has been at DHHL, these "special deals" for friends have stopped and due diligence reviews are once again being undertaken by DHHL.

Jobie Masagatani has brought planning & organization to DHHL. Because of her initiative, Federal funds needed by the Homestead were not lost but were applied to homestead programs. Because of her initiative, Energy Producers are now able to bring opportunities to DHHL for critically needed revenues and benefits that could facilitate homestead agricultural uses. Please confirm Jobie Masagatani.

We helped provide training to over 36 Hawaiian homestead communities' residents and their leaders through various venues.

We submit this testimony in *strong support of the confirmation of Jobie Masagatani as Director of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL)* and as such she has achieved and accomplished the following activities during her appointment beginning in May 2012.

We acknowledge the excellent work and accomplishments during the past months since Jobie's nomination as its Director designate in working with all of the homestead leaderships and residents in providing access to and outreach to all concerns regarding the programs and services to enrich these communities and its residents. The encouragement of leadership development on all levels of the homesteads was realized at conference held early during her administration which helped every association whether affiliated or independent to realize their potential growth towards self-governance and working to improve their communities.

This allows DHHL to dedicate their limited resources on building homes and other infrastructure for residential and commercial use and promoting economic development opportunities.

Honorable Senators:

About CNHA

CNHA is a 12-year nonprofit with a mission of *enhancing the cultural, economic, political and community development of Native Hawaiians*. We achieve our mission through the administration of a Public Policy Center, a Certified Lending and Investment Service, the Hawaiian Way Fund for cultural and community practitioners, and the coordination of the Annual Native Hawaiian Convention.

We are a highly impactful Hawaii nonprofit that delivers services to low and moderate income families, development of community facilities, and effective policy analysis and advocacy with an expertise in federal trust land policies as well as community development methodologies.

Public Policy Work

The policy positions taken by CNHA do not represent the positions of member organizations or board members. Indeed, even the attached CNHA board resolution of 'no confidence' adopted on January 11, 2013, which was acted on unanimously by every board member in attendance, we know and absolutely respect that there will be members that will have a completely different position.

Hence, each and every policy position we may take, is expressly the policy position of CNHA, which may be influenced or based on manao we receive from member organizations and our board of directors. This is a very important and significant distinction that has served our members well, and advanced policy advocacy for our community at both the state and federal level.

Attached to this testimony is a listing of our Policy Center priorities for this year, providing an excellent example of the diversity of issues that we will work on during the 2013 calendar year.

CNHA Position on Nominee

CNHA does not recommend the confirmation by the Senate of Ms. Masagatani to the Directorship of DHHL. This is not a position we would have preferred, nor should it reflect upon Ms. Masagatani personally or other positions she might otherwise be well suited for, it is however, the only honest position CNHA can take given the experiences with Ms. Masagatani over the last 8 months.

8 months is a significant amount of time to determine capabilities, results, and leadership qualities. It is a significant amount of time to judge actions compared to words, problem solving and communication skills, and the ability to work with diverse partners, regardless of prior history with them. The fact is, government officials at the level of Directorship that will Chair a major Commission, requires a level of skill, knowledge and decisiveness that we have found to be lacking on even an elementary basis.

A handful of basic policy issues that are concerning are as follows:

- 1. **Budget & Nelson Case.** This nominee intends to spend general lease revenues from special funds for administrative functions and 66 government staff positions, ruled on in the Nelson Case to be prohibited, as is evidenced from the DHHL budget submitted to the Legislature. We do not believe this nominee embraces the fiduciary responsibility to beneficiaries of the land trust beyond the bureaucracy and convenience of state government.
- 2. **Independent Legal Counsel.** This nominee is incapable of balancing the helm of a state agency and chairing the governing body responsible to act in the best interests of beneficiaries of a federally created land trust. When asked if the Hawaiian Homes Commission should have the ability to access separate legal counsel for legal interpretations and opinions, which may in fact avoid costly litigation, the nominee is not sure, completely comfortable with only the opinions of the Attorney General's office.
- 3. **Federal Rules.** This nominee has not shown support in the short term and long term solution to establishing consistency of the state's administration of the Hawaiian Home Land trust through the federal rule making process. Instead, the nominee is seeking an informal Memorandum of Understanding with the federal Department of Interior, which is weak in form, and does not provide the full transparency and participation of the public and beneficiary class available in the federal rule making process.
- 4. **Consultation & Communication.** This nominee has taken 8 months to meet with homestead association leaders by island, and only scheduled meetings 10 days prior to this confirmation hearing to garner support. It should be noted that the only island she has not met with, is the island of Kauai.
- 5. **FHA 247 MOU.** When this nominee took office 8 months ago, policy work of CNHA and homestead leaders statewide, to renegotiate a Lingle/Bush MOU that caps the borrowing capacity of homestead families lower than that of other Americans halted. After 5 years of work, two months prior to her arrival, we worked with DHHL and HUD to draft new MOU in draft form and positioned it to be scheduled for Commission review and FHA consideration. It has not moved for 8 months, while thousands of families are negatively impacted financially.

Senators, it is not easy for anyone to oppose a nomination of the Governor of the State. We don't expect many individuals or organizations to do so. It would be much easier for us to support, and even easier to be silent. It is always difficult to not be able to support a nominee that may come before the Senate. Ms. Masagatani is no different, and in all earnest, we have hoped for and waited every month for 8 months to experience policy reasons to be able to support this confirmation.

The opposite has become evident, not just on policy issues, but on critical management and leadership skills which have been a detriment to our work and service to homestead communities, with a pattern of deliberate intention.

- 1. It is not okay for a Director of our government agency, to **threaten a homestead leader**, as was done to a member of the Waimea Hawaiian Homesteaders Association, that she will create delays on their projects if they work with CNHA, or certain members of its staff.
- 2. It is not okay for a government official and public servant to be **non-responsive** to our organization and our work in homestead communities or any organization that seeks to meet with or communicate with the Director to resolve challenges and/or find solutions.

For example, an affordable housing contract between DHHL and CNHA was **forced into expiration** due to an inability to meet with the Director and continue the extension negotiations that were underway prior to her arrival. As a result, 60 affordable homes with price points of \$185,000 and less on 4-bedroom homes was lost to beneficiaries of the trust.

- 3. It is not acceptable to **delay payment** on an outstanding invoice owed to CNHA in the amount of \$1.4M still unpaid, even after waiting 8 full months since her appointment.
- 4. It is not okay for a Chair of the Hawaiian Homes Commission to deliberately use the position of Chair to **thwart business items** of the public to be scheduled on the agenda for action by the Commission, as has been done to CNHA and its homestead organization partners. Specifically, the Anahola Hawaiian Homes Association on Kauai has experienced a grueling, hostile 8-month delay that threatens \$6M in private financing on an Albizia Tree removal project. Meanwhile, similar projects and actions are scheduled and taken up immediately for other organizations.
- 5. It is not okay for a public servant and government official at the level of Director, to inform the Chairman of our CNHA board of directors that she **will not work with** a specific staff member, namely the CEO for personal reasons. It is not okay for any public servant of our government to make a constituent, or any organization, including CNHA, invisible, nor to create an unfriendly and antagonistic environment at our own state agency. Especially, where our mission for 12 years has been closely tied to partnerships with government agencies like DHHL, and especially over personal reasons.

We do not believe this to be the case in general, toward all constituent organizations or individuals, however, it has been the case for CNHA and certain homestead organization partners and members of CNHA. It does mean however, that this nominee is capable of abusing the privilege of the Directorship of a state agency and Chairmanship of a Commission, and plainly put, there is no place for this in our government. Not one, nor any constituent should suffer this treatment.

Senators our position is not based on shallow popularity contests, but rather actual policy beliefs and actions taken by this nominee over the last 8 months. We do not believe this nominee has the communication skills, professionalism and maturity to work with a diverse constituency and the complex issues of a land trust administered by a state agency. We do not believe this nominee has an adequate grasp of the importance of partnerships with beneficiary organizations, or the intent of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act as a vehicle to serve, facilitate, empower and not govern, the beneficiary class established in the law. Frankly, given the fiscal condition of the trust, partnerships are absolutely vital to the health of the land trust and its ability to achieve its constitutional purposes.

We restate that it has been difficult to step forward to oppose any nominee of a Governor of the State. We are compelled however to share with you, our experience with this nominee, where we have remained open, continued to reach out, maintained an 'issues over personalities' posture to pursue the delivery of our services to homestead families statewide. With the exception of the last few days, it has been an unnecessary journey of frustration, non-responsiveness, no ability to discuss issues or potential solutions, poor partnering practices and a detrimental 8 months to our organization and to our mission of *enhancing the cultural*, *economic*, *political and community development of Native Hawaiians*.

As a matter of record, CNHA has worked with 5 different Directors over our 12-year history, and none have been as difficult to work with, than this nominee. With former Directors, CNHA and DHHL, together, created the Home Ownership Assistance Program (HOAP) reaching thousands with financial education, developed the first Group Owner Builder product specifically for homesteads resulting in 22 affordable homes constructed, the construction of numerous community facilities with non-state resources, the establishment of Beneficiary Consultation as a policy practice, standardized the application of county housing credits statewide, and the creation of a beneficiary capital fund to ensure residential solar technology is widely available on the homesteads.

With our homestead partners and CNHA members on Kauai we have successful negotiated the first and only commercial grade solar farm anticipated to produce 12Mwh on Hawaiian Home lands providing the land trust with market rate lease rents and homestead benefits for jobs and economic opportunities. On Hawaii Island, we are supporting and partnering with the homestead association on a critical agricultural complex that includes an agricultural park, a renewable energy facility to offset energy costs, a certified kitchen and post harvest facility. In another homestead, we are constructing a community enterprise center to advance small businesses, and we are assisting in the development of a Kumu and Youth camp on Hawaiian Home lands, all with leveraged non-state resources.

We hope for a different reality over the next 2 years, that CNHA might continue to be among the many organizations that are necessary to partner with and assist DHHL in meeting the goals of the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act. Mahalo.

Board of Directors Resolution of No Confidence in Interim Director of DHHL

Whereas, CNHA founded in 2001, unifies and serves a national network of more than 150 Native Hawaiian Organizations, providing assistance in accessing capital and technical resources, and is a policy voice on issues important to Native Hawaiians; and

Whereas, CNHA achieves its mission to work for the cultural, economic, political and community development of Native Hawaiians, through its certification as a Native community development financial institution, its community development projects, the administration of the Hawaiian Way Fund supporting cultural practitioners, and the operation of its Native Hawaiian Policy Center; and

Whereas, CNHA is governed by board of directors with 21 seats elected by voting members of the nonprofit corporation; and

Whereas, CNHA board members are Native Hawaiian leaders and experts in a variety of fields including culture, education, affordable housing, economic development, advocacy and civic engagement, small business as well as trust land practices; and

Whereas, the interim appointee to the Director of the state of Hawaii Department of Hawaiian Home Lands (DHHL), Ms. Jobie Masagatani was made in May of 2012, and will be considered by the State of Hawaii Senate for confirmation in 2013; and

Whereas, this Directorship is the principal executive to implement the policies and directives of the 9-member Hawaiian Homes Commission that governs and administers the federal Hawaiian Homes Commission Act; and

Whereas, this Directorship is significant to the goals and well-being of the Native Hawaiian community, Hawaiian homestead associations and to the mission of CNHA in advancing sound and transparent public trust land policies, as well as economic and community development projects in compliance with the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act; and

Whereas, since May of 2012, an 8-month period, the interim Director has led DHHL in a manner detrimental to Hawaiian homestead association projects, CNHA affordable housing programs and policies advancing the tenets of the HHCA as follows:

- 1. Hawaii Administrative Rule Violations. The interim Director has shown a disregard for the Hawaiian Home Commission, its other members and the public with business for deliberation by the Commission. Violations of Hawaii Administrative Rules 10-2-8 include the refusal of the interim Director to place business items on the monthly agenda duly submitted. These violations thwart the responsibilities and authority of the Commission, as well as the beneficiaries of the trust to be served by their trust.
- 2. Homestead Association Controlled Projects. The interim Director has with intent, created delays, difficulties and barriers to projects of duly recognized homestead associations and their development nonprofits on Hawaiian Home Lands in compliance with the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, including projects of the Waimea Hawaiian Homesteaders Association, the Anahola Hawaiian Homes Association, the Nanakuli Community Homestead Association, and the Association of Hawaiians for Homestead Lands, all of which are members of CNHA. The actions and in-action of the interim Director has placed

in jeopardy more than \$50 million dollars in private capital on projects located on Oahu, Kauai and Hawaii Island.

- 3. Affordable Housing Projects. One of the first actions taken by the interim Director upon her appointment in May of 2012 was to refuse to meet with or to continue the extension negotiations started with the prior Director on a three-year contract with CNHA to produce 89 affordable homes on Oahu and Kauai, 22 of which were completed at price points of \$158,000 and \$185,000 on four-bedroom homes. With intent, the interim Director forced the expiration of the contract, cutting off the completion of seven families qualified by CNHA, and the remaining 60 homes planned to be constructed under the terms of the contract.
- **4. Federal Oversight & Federal Rules.** The interim Director has indicated opposition to the promulgation of federal rules by the Department of Interior that would assist DHHL and the State in administering Hawaiian Homes in compliance with required federal oversight, and with consistency regardless of state government administration changes. It is well understood that federal rules will inhibit abuses by state government.
- **5.** Leadership Integrity. The interim Director informed the CNHA Board Chairman, Alvin Parker and Board Committee Chair, Maile Meyer, that simply for her personal reasons, she will not work with CNHA. The past 8 months have born this commitment out, to the detriment of CNHA, a beneficiary organization serving mutual beneficiaries statewide, and homestead projects wherein CNHA is affiliated or a partner.
- 6. Management Competency. The interim Director has shown an inability to manage even the most basic elements of the agency to be responsive in returning phone calls, emails, or in processing standard documents for timely payments or in responding to safety issues reported to DHHL. Together with the inability to resist temptations of abusing the power of the Director office as described in item 5 above, the interim Director does not represent the type of collaborative management skills that are vitally important in facing the fiscal realities posed by the expiration of Act 14 funding. Management skills must reflect an ability to work across the spectrum of organizations to achieve the mission of the trust.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the CNHA Board of Directors hereby expresses no confidence in the nominee that will be considered for confirmation by the State of Hawaii Senate during the 2013 legislative session; and

THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the CNHA Board of Directors with great deference for the public confirmation process, and for the kuleana of Governor Abercrombie to put forward a nominee, hereby conveys to the State Senate Committee on Hawaiian Affairs, chaired by Senator Brickwood Galuteria to not recommend Ms. Jobie Masagatani to be confirmed by the full Senate.

CNHA produces its annual policy priorities based on input from its member organizations and community leaders throughout the year.

Local Policy Priorities - OHA & DHHL State Agencies

- 1. OHA/DHHL Agricultural & Pastoral Homesteading (2009): Establish an OHA Agricultural and Pastoral Homesteading program with technical resources, loan funds and dedicated grants.
- **2.** OHA/DHHL Grant Resources to Beneficiary Organizations (2010): Implement annual review and reporting of grant awards to beneficiary controlled nonprofit organizations compared to all grants awarded, and strengthen policies that result in greater awards to beneficiary controlled nonprofit organizations.
- **3. OHA/DHHL Operating Budgets (2012):** Strengthen Beneficiary Consultation on trust resources and agency budgetary processes to increase transparency of trust fund expenditures and increase beneficiary recommendations in agency budgets.
- **4.** OHA/DHHL Job Openings (2011): Post job openings widely via Native Hawaiian electronic networks to increase knowledge about state government jobs at OHA and DHHL. Report all vacant positions and new hires funded by trust funds to the Board of Trustees and the Hawaiian Homes Commission monthly. DHHL implementation of HHCA section 202 (b) on new and vacant civil service positions, to qualified Hawaiians.
- **5. OHA/DHHL State CIP Funds (2012)** Assist beneficiary organizations to identify and promote projects relevant and eligible for state Capital Improvement Project bond funding to be included in state government CIP budgets.
- **6.** OHA/DHHL Program Partnership (2012-SCHHA) Execute program partnerships to fulfill the OHA/DHHL resolution on the Ceded Lands Settlement to serve the mutual beneficiaries of these public trusts.
- **7. DHHL Legal Counsel (2012-SCHHA).** Hawaiian Homes Commission to fund and retain separate legal counsel to represent the interests of the beneficiaries at all Hawaiian Homes Commission meetings.
- **8.** DHHL Adequate Funding (2012-SCHHA): Adequately fund DHHL government employees and operating costs from state General Funds and not the Trust Funds of beneficiaries per the Hawaii Supreme Court ruling in the Nelson case. Reimburse the land trust for prior years of expenditures. Annually request adequate CIP funds to fulfill the mission of the HHCA.
- **9.** DHHL Improve Federal Oversight of HHCA (2011- SCHHA): Raise awareness and accountability of state government's administration of the federal Hawaiian Homes Commission Act through the promulgation of federal administrative rules by the Department of Interior for the HHCA and the Hawaiian Home Land Recovery Act (HHLRA).

State & Federal Policy Priorities

- **5. Federal Education/Housing (2010):** Reauthorize the Native Hawaiian Education Act, to strengthen funding allocations to education and language nonprofit schools, improves the governance structure of the Native Hawaiian Education Council, and localizes technical assistance to grant applicants. Reauthorize the Native Hawaiian Housing Block Grant by the Congress, with increased usage on actual housing units versus subdivision development.
- **6. Federal <u>Federal Program Unity Project (2010):</u>** Identify successful federal programs that are relevant to Native Hawaiians for inclusion based on Native status. Include Substantially Underserved Trust Areas (SUTA) as defined for some USDA programs, to be a standard eligibility definition for USDA (rural development and housing programs), Treasury (CDFI Fund) and HUD (CDBG) programs to increase service and eligibility of Native populations nationally. ANA Set-a-Side for Pacific Territories.
- 7. Federal <u>Native Hawaiian-to-Dol Relationship (2012):</u> Establish partnerships to convene Native Hawaiians with federal officials at Dol annually, to share experiences and best practices of Dol-Insular Affairs, Dol-Bureau of Indian Affairs and Dol-Office of Native Hawaiian Relations.
- 8. State Act 55: Public Land Development Corporation (2012): Amend or Repeal Act 55 to protect and comply with federal requirements and Hawaii constitutional mandates on the use of public lands and the unique responsibility to Native Hawaiians.
- **9. State Water Commission Appointments (2012):** Insist on the appointment of Water Commissioners that meet the eligibility criteria to properly represent Native Hawaiian interests & cultural practices.

Program Priority from CNHA Network

Implement Civic Engagement Initiative (2012): Develop and implement a year-round civic engagement initiative to register voters, and in election years to increase the actual voting percentages by the CNHA Network of Members.

Improve NGO Access to State of Hawaii CIP Resources (2012): Develop a guide to accessing State CIP resources for Non-Governmental Organizations, and assist community leaders to present CIP eligible projects through the State of Hawaii system.



I was an eight year employee of DHHL and am an undivided interest lessee of Kanehili. I loved my job and the opportunity to serve fellow beneficiaries.

I resigned from DHHL because I could not tolerate the lack of leadership, communication, unprofessional behavior and cruelty of Ms. Masagatani at DHHL.

Jobie lacks effective communication skills. Her inability to provide clear direction to employees harbored uncertainty and inefficiency. She was unclear about her goals and strategy to advance the mission of the trust. Her ability to ignore and/or disregard certain employees was stunning and unbecoming of a professional at that level of leadership.
