The Trust for Public Land supports HB1424. The Trust for Public Land is not involved in the acquisition of Honolua Bay and Lipoa Point but as a national nonprofit land trust that has worked in Hawai'i since 1979, we clearly see the urgent need to protect cherished Honolua Bay and Lipoa Point from development, and support the State and the Hawaiian Islands Land Trust in this important conservation effort. Members of Save Honolua Coalition showed The Trust for Public Land the property in 2012. Honolua Bay and Lipoa Point is a very special place with irreplaceable Hawaiian cultural sites, great agricultural potential, a thriving marine ecosystem, and a surrounding community that both uses the property regularly for recreation and also assists in stewardship efforts. Protection of this property and increased appropriate stewardship will benefit all the generations to come.

The Trust for Public Land (TPL) is a national, non-profit 501(c)(3) land conservation organization that conserves land for people to enjoy as parks, gardens, and other natural places, ensuring livable communities for generations to come. Since TPL's first conservation project in Hawai'i in 1979, TPL has completed 27 projects on all five of the main Hawaiian Islands, and protected over 42,000 acres. TPL partners with government agencies and other nonprofit 501(c)(3) organizations to acquire land for conservation, cultural preservation, parks, and agriculture. The Trust for Public Land facilitates the land transaction, takes title to the protected land for a short period of time, and then transfers the land to either a government agency or to a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization.
