TESTIMONY OF ROBERT TOYOFUKU ON BEHALF OF THE HAWAII ASSOCIATION FOR JUSTICE (HAJ) IN SUPPORT OF H.B. NO. 426

My name is Bob Toyofuku and I am presenting this testimony on behalf of the Hawaii Association for Justice (HAJ) in SUPPORT of H.B. No. 426, relating to Firearms.

The purpose of this measure is to repeal the exception for NRA certified firearms instructors currently codified in HRS § 663-9.5(f) relating to the use of firearms. HAJ supports this measure because there is no known liability crisis related to NRA certified firearms trainers nor is there sufficient data to justify departure from the basic principle that ultrahazardous activities require a corresponding higher standard of care. There is no doubt that the handling of firearms is an ultrahazardous activity deserving of the absolute liability provided in HRS § 663-9.5.

The liability of gun owners found in section 663-9.5 was codified in 1994. There has not been a single instance where an NRA certified trainer has been held liable under section 663-9.5 during the almost 20 year existence of the section. There is no reasonable basis for the sweeping exemption for NRA certified trainers. Firearms are extremely dangerous and require the highest care in their handling and use. This section serves to encourage safe handling of firearms. NRA certified trainers possess the highest degree of knowledge, skill and care in the safe handling of firearms such that the exception should not be required. The fact that no NRA certified trainer has ever been subject to liability under section 663-9.5 shows that the exemption is unnecessary for firearms courses properly taught by NRA certified trainers.

Under 663-9.5 (b) gun owner absolute liability applies only to his/her own shooting of the weapon and not if others shoot the gun. So in a gun training class the NRA certified trainer would only be liable if he/she shot someone. The NRA trainer is not liable under 663-9.5 if the person being trained shoots another person with a gun provided by the trainer or brought by the trainee. In other words, if the NRA certified trainer brings extra guns for trainees to use during the training session, the trainer is not liable for the trainee's use of the gun under 663-9.5(b) because liability when the gun is not in the possession of the owner is specifically exempted. Similarly, the trainer is not liable when the trainee brings and uses their own gun because 663-9.5(a) only applies to the trainer's own gun. The exemption thus currently applies to an NRA certified trainer for his/her own shooting of another individual. There is no compelling reason to relieve certified trainers from liability where they shoot others.

If there are specific circumstances related to NRA certified training sessions that merit exceptions to an owner's responsibility to properly handle their weapons, these circumstances should be addressed specifically and dealt with narrowly rather than with a broad exemption.

# Re: HB 426

Good afternoon Chair Rhoads and Vice Chair Har,

My name is Bill Richter and I am an NRA certified firearms instructor and instructor trainer. I am also President of the not-for-profit organization, Lessons in Firearms Education (LIFE) and am here to speak in opposition to HB 426.

First, let me provide a little background. For the last 10 years, firearms purchases in Hawaii have reached record highs each year. Recently, the increased volume of firearms purchases has resulted in long lines at the Firearms Registration section at HPD, at times the lines have reached around the corner and waiting times have exceeded 6 hours.

At LIFE, our classes are always full, sometimes months in advance and students report difficultly finding the necessary State mandated training, either with us or other instructors across the State. Recently LIFE has worked with a business on Maui to bring much needed training to Maui but even that seems unlikely to keep up with the demand for training.

I bring this up because I believe HB 426 will discourage some NRA Instructors from providing this much needed training for fear of the potential liability. Fewer instructors mean fewer opportunities for new gun owners to obtain the State mandated training, which, as I am sure you would agree, is detrimental to everyone's goal of safer gun owners.

In Hawaii you may not purchase a handgun without first obtaining the State required training, yet are required to have 2 hours of live fire with handguns. This means that instructors must provide their own handguns for this training. One of the problems with providing firearms for training, is that the owner of any firearm is "absolutely liable" for any damage or injury caused by their gun, even absent any negligence by the gun owner. The other, associated problem is that you are not allowed to "loan" your handgun to anyone. So, as an instructor, you can never really relinquish

control ("Constructive possession")<sup>2</sup> of your firearm, and therefore if anyone using your firearm, in the course of lawful activity, causes an injury or damages property, the firearm owner and not the person that actually fired the gun, is responsible for those injuries or damages.

NRA instructors have not always enjoyed this limited exemption to liability. In fact, we just received it July 9, 2012, when Governor Abercrombie signed HB 679 into law. Gov. Abercrombie must have agreed with me and other instructors that more firearms instructors mean more safety classes, which ultimately leads to more safe and trained new gun owners, which we all can agree is a good thing.

The argument against HB 679 last year, and one that will probably be used in supporting HB 426 now, is that there has never been an instance where an instructor was found liable under the circumstances related to teaching the State mandated training and therefore the exemption isn't needed. That argument rings somewhat hollow in light of similar liability exemptions requested and received by the State and counties in regards to firearms owned by them, but issued to law enforcement officers. <sup>3</sup> Indeed, if the State and counties perceive a significant liability exposure related to the use of firearms by its law enforcement officers, then recognizing a similar exposure by NRA instructors isn't really a big stretch.

If the goal is to foster continued and consistent, high caliber training for new gun owners in Hawaii, any efforts that might reduce the pool of instructors necessary to provide this training is a bad idea. I believe HB 426 will, if passed, reduce the number of instructors willing to provide this necessary training. We need to encourage more training, not less; and more learning opportunities, not fewer.

I humbly ask that you oppose HB 426.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> Constructive possession is a legal theory used to extend possession to situations where a person has no hands-on custody of an object. Most courts say that constructive possession, also sometimes called "possession in law," exists where a person has knowledge of an object plus the ability to control the object, even if the person has no physical contact with it (United States v. Derose, 74 F.3d 1177 [11th Cir. 1996]). For example, people often keep important papers and other valuable items in a bank safety deposit box. Although they do not have actual physical custody of these items, they do have knowledge of the items and the ability to exercise control over them. Thus, under the doctrine of constructive possession, they are still considered in possession of the contents of their safety deposit box.

My name is Devin Sasai and I am an NRA Certified Firearms Instructor and Range Safety Officer. I am one of those that this particular bill targets. I have a great responsibility when I instruct a group of students in the safe and proper handling of firearms. It is a responsibility that I thoroughly and very humbly accept with each class that I teach. Whether you are for gun rights or gun control, one thing that I truly believe that we all can agree on is that *everyone* that owns a firearm should be able to handle that firearm safely at all times. The Second Amendment of our Constitution gives us "the right to keep and bear arms", but as responsible, law abiding citizens, it is up to us to guard that right, and to make sure that those who share it are aware of the great responsibility that comes when you exercise that right.

When I teach my classes, I have a favorite question that I like to ask my students when they pose a subjective question to me. Whether they ask what caliber is better, or what handgun is better, or what brands are better, I always ask them in return; "What is the end game?" What is the goal? What is the result that you in particular want to achieve? So I ask you all today. What is the end game?

By submitting this bill, what are we all really accomplishing? What we are accomplishing is making sure that instructors will become free targets because of the negligence of another. What we will accomplish is a group of instructors that may choose not to teach anymore for fear of liability suits against them. What we will accomplish is a public who will lack the proper knowledge of safe firearms handling because of the limited number of instructors brought on because those who can teach either choose not to or can't afford the proper liability insurance that it requires.

We all know that in some way, shape, or form, there will be firearms amongst us. I for one would feel much safer knowing that those who have them have been properly trained to safely handle that firearm. For that to happen, we need to have trained competent instructors, and we need to make sure that if they are helping protect our community with their knowledge, their skills, and their passion, that we in return protect them by making sure they are afforded a certain amount of protection under the law.

I humbly ask that you kill this bill in committee, and allow all firearms instructors the protection that they so richly deserve. Allow them to continue to make our community safer by turning out the next generation of responsible firearm owners. I thank the committee Chairman and it's Members for the opportunity and time to hear my testimony.

Comments: I wish to speak in OPPOSITION to House Bill 426 (HB426). The Hawaii Legislature passed a law in 2012 to give firearms Instructors partial immunity from incidents during the safety classes offered, and REQUIRED BY LAW, for a handgun permit. This law provides a measure of protection against lawsuits under Hawaii's "absolute liability" law for gun owners. This bill would undo that important law. Because these safety classes are MANDATORY, there needs to be a provision to insure that instructors remain available to teach these classes, unless the legislature simultaneously provides funding and directs public servants to teach these courses, and has the state assume that liability itself, or eliminates the requirement for live fire practice as part of the class requirement. Any provisions that would prevent these classes from being readily available would introduce constitutional issues under the 2nd and 14th amendments, which is probably not the intent of the legislature. In particular, the Privileges or Immunities Clause (Amendment XIV, Section 1, Clause 2 of the United States Constitution) states: "No State shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States." If classes are required, a pattern of laws which serve to make these classes unavailable would constitute a clear infringement of a protected right which has been affirmed in numerous court challenges. It would also be appropriate to review District of Columbia v. Heller, 554 U.S. 570 (2008), where the Supreme Court affirms an individual right, McDonald v. Chicago, 561 U.S. 3025 (2010), where state and local governments are limited to the same extent as the federal government, and Ezell v. Chicago, decided July 6, 2011, where the Seventh Circuit found unconstitutional a City of Chicago law requiring firearms training at a shooting range to obtain a gun permit, but made this range training unavailable within the City. Please reject this regressive bill.

I am an NRA-certified pistol safety instructor, and I am writing to voice my strong opposition to HB246, the repeal of liability protection for NRA-certified firearms instructors.

Everyone supports the ideal that all firearms owners be properly trained in the use of their firearms. This is a singularly common sense idea about gun ownership, and has been embraced by both pro- and anti-gun communities as a way to enhance public safety.

As such, NRA instructors providing state-mandated training offer a public service, as gun owners who have completed an NRA-approved firearm safety curriculum are safer than their counterparts who have not. Those instructors, who take to our state's ranges every weekend with new and inexperienced shooters, are undertaking enough risk as it is. Many of us provide training on a volunteer basis, to keep the cost to the student as low as possible. In return, we are being offered the repeal of a statute which provided reasonable protection against frivolous lawsuits.

The passage of this bill would have a chilling effect on Hawaii's firearms instructors, and will lead to long wait times to schedule an open seat in a safety class, spiraling cost for attending those classes, and will very likely lead some individuals to skip the class entirely and obtain a firearm through illegal channels.

Here are my thoughts on the subject:

HRS 134-2 states that to acquire a handgun permit you must have proof of Hunter Education Course or other authorized Handgun Safety Training for example a NRA Pistol Safety Course taught by a Certified NRA Instructor to acquire a pistol permit..

Having been through both courses I can give you a comparison.

The Hunter Education Course is a wonderful course which I completely enjoyed and learned about hunting Hawaii's species and the proper use of firearms in general while hunting. Most of the emphasis was placed on long guns. However at no time did we receive any hands on training or any specific training on the pistol. This was all classroom instruction. I only wished that the course was longer and was more accessable. It turns out that there is a very long waiting list to get into this course.

When I purchased my first hand gun I was in my fifties and had not used a firearm since I was a soldier in the Viet Nam war. I was very happy to get the personal hands on training. I was able to ask questions that meant something to me personally. The NRA instructor presented me with a range of pistols to test fire and helped me choose the firearm best suited for my needs. If this had not been the case how would I have made an educated choice of pistol?

After acquiring my pistol I still sought out qualified people to help me improve my skills with the pistol. Within a few years this led me to be a NRA Certified Instructor. Now I volunteer most of my time to promoting firearms safety. I have not taken any compensation as of yet.

I would be very happy if members of the committee would join me for a day at the range. This would give you a firsthand look at the gun safety issue and responsible gun ownership.

# TESTIMONY IN OPPOSITION TO HAWAII HB426 Hawaii State Capitol - January 29, 2013

HB426 seeks to repeal partial immunity (hereinafter noted only as 'immunity') of National Rifle Association (NRA) certified firearms instructors against lawsuits under Hawaii's "absolute liability" law for gun owners. However, HB426 has no merit, as Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS) Title 36, Chapter 663, Section 9.5 - Liability of Firearm Owners - Paragraph (d), specifically states: "This section does not apply when the discharge of a firearm was legally justified."

- 1. HRS Title 10, Chapter 134, Section 2 *Permits to Acquire*, Paragraph (g) makes it mandatory that an applicant for a handgun or revolver permit MUST COMPLETE APPROVED EDUCATION OR TRAINING PRIOR TO ISSUANCE OF A PERMIT TO ACQUIRE.
- 2. Paragraph (g), Subsection (4) of HRS 134-2 further states that the mandatory training may be accomplished by a firearms training or safety course conducted by a National Rifle Association certified firearms instructor, WHICH TRAINING INCLUDES, AMONG OTHER REQUIREMENTS, A MINIMUM OF TWO HOURS OF FIRING TRAINING AT A FIRING RANGE.
- 3. Since the permit applicant seeking mandatory training obviously does not yet have a permit to acquire a firearm, he <u>necessarily</u> relies on the instructor to provide the training firearm.
- 4. Therefore, when a National Rifle Association certified firearms instructor (or any authorized instructor) is engaged in mandatory training of a citizen in fulfillment of Hawaii state law prior to issuance of a pistol or revolver permit to acquire, **discharge of the trainer's firearm is legally justified, indeed required, and therefore exempt from the absolute liability clause under Paragraph (d).**

Paragraph (f) of HRS 663-9.5 merely serves to affirm the intent of Paragraph (d) as it applies specifically to NRA certified firearms instructors. The expenditure of limited legislative time and resources in pursuit of HB426 proposing to strike paragraph (f) makes no sense in light of the broader immunity conferred by paragraph (d). Further, the attempt to appeal the immunity conferred to National Rifle Association certified firearms instructors is grossly inconsistent with the intent of Hawaii's mandatory firearms training, as it serves to discourage highly qualified NRA certified instructors from sharing their considerable knowledge and providing the hands-on training the state requires. HB426 should be immediately withdrawn without further consideration.

#### Dear Representative Har,

I am writing as one of your constituents in Kapolei (and a Life NRA member and gun owner) to ask your assistance in stopping House Bill 426. The State of Hawaii rightly insists that individuals who seek to own handguns first participate in safety training by a certified instructor as part of its acquisition and registration system. The NRA and LIFE certified firearms instructors provide a very valuable service to both our citizens and the State by providing the necessary training at low cost and with high frequency. Those who wish to lawfully own a handgun are provided with every opportunity to meet the State requirements for safety training at minimal cost to themselves and no cost to the State (or City/County). It is also important to keep in mind that most instructors do not offer this service as their primary employment, but out of love for the sport and out of concern that new owners learn how to safely handle a firearm so that neither they nor their family and friends will be injured by unsafe handling practices.

In 2012 the legislature wisely recognized the value of the safety training being provided by NRA and LIFE certified firearms instructors and granted them a limitation of liability to lawsuit for accidents which occur during such training. Given the poor safety awareness most new gun owners exhibit, accidents WILL happen and it is important that the firearms instructors not be held liable when they have exercised due caution with inexperienced gun handlers. Quite frankly, given our litigious society I am not sure if I admire the certified instructors or consider them crazy for undertaking such an activity without the limit of liability as they did prior to 2012 and as they would be expected to do if HB426 is passed into law.

It is my personal belief that individuals interested in acquiring handguns will find a way to do so. I would rather that they do so within the safety training and registration process already in place. If safety training becomes relatively unavailable due to the liability aspects of providing that service, the whole system will break down. Frustration and fear will drive many to acquire handguns outside the legal framework, particularly in the current environment, and those guns will remain unregistered, defeating the whole purpose of the current system.

Please consider for a moment who HB426 will benefit. It will not benefit the instructors, it will not benefit prospective gun owners, it will not benefit the police and it will not benefit the State of Hawaii, which has one of the more effective safety training and registration systems in effect today. The only beneficiaries will be the Hawaii plaintiff lawyers, who opposed the limited liability legislation passed last year. Was their opposition based in principle? No, it was based on financial self-interest. Limiting liability limited what they could seek in damages and, therefore, what they could extract in fees. It also meant that they couldn't reach for the deeper pockets, those who certified the firearms safety instructors.

Lastly, I am a Libertarian by political philosophy and a strict Constitutionalist. Seldom have I been able to convince myself to vote for a Democrat as I did when I voted for Mike Gabbard and as I did this year when I voted for you. I did not vote for you in 2010 because you were an unknown quantity, but I considered your record when I voted this year and found that you seemed to be fair-minded. I also found that your opponent and her spouse were running for office for reasons of financial self-interest that violated my sense of ethics in the same way that Representative Saiki now violates my sense of ethics.

I personally find it offensive and a sanctionable conflict-of-interest for Representative Scott Saiki (Moilili, McCully, Kaimuki), himself an active personal injury lawyer, to have introduced HB426. It is CLEARLY in his own personal financial interest to drive this Bill forward in an effort to increase the potential for large personal injury awards. I would ask that you refer him to the Ethics Committee for, at minimum, censure in engaging in an action that promoted his own self-interest. I also ask that you work with the other members of the Judiciary Committee to either remove this Bill from the calendar for this ethics violation or work to defeat it.

Our firearms safety instructors need limited immunity when teaching. Please kill this bill.

As an NRA certified Law Enforcement Instructor for Pistol and Shotgun, current volunteer Lessons In Firearms Education (LIFE) instructor for the Basic Firearm Safety course as required by HRS, and current firearms instructor for the United States Navy, I see the consequences of the proposed bill as follows:

- 1. **Education**: Decreased access to education in proper firearms safety and awareness, possibly resulting in an increase of mishaps due to negligence and ignorance.
- 2. Restriction: Decreased availability of firearms safety courses such that the limitation becomes a restriction to otherwise lawful purchase of a firearm, possibly resulting in an increase of violent encounters in which the victim is unable to adequately defend themselves or loved ones against a larger attacker, more physically capable attacker or several attackers, a disparity of force scenario.
- Disenfranchisement: Decreased ability to attend a firearms safety course due to increased
  cost of the class. This disenfranchisement of a sector of population, unable to afford a firearms
  safety class, could lead to an increased population of victims of violent crime in depressed
  neighborhoods.
- 4. **Response**: Since typically violent encounters only last for seconds, calling 911 and the subsequent response will be time late, and definitely not in time to stop the criminal actions.
- 5. **Crime**: The law will not deter, decrease the propensity, or hamper the ability of criminals to commit crimes with firearms.
- 6. **Citizens lose**: The law will not decrease the number of firearms in the possession of criminals; only law abiding citizens will be negatively affected.
- 7. **Criminals win**: The law does not deter those that are going to commit crimes, only guarantees that bystanders will become victims.
- 8. **Crime continues**: Likelihood of increase in disparity of force situations during home invasions and/or burglaries, when the homeowner is home. The criminal has nothing to fear from the homeowner, and has a better chance of success, and will continue to commit crimes.

In short, this law is intended to make it more difficult to lawfully obtain a firearm, which will not allow the law abiding citizen to adequately defend themselves and loved ones, will give carte blanche to criminals, leading to increased rates of violent crimes or crimes against the person.

Chairs and Committee Members:

I oppose HB 426 which seeks to repeal H.Rev.Stat. § 663-9.5(f) which provides an exemption for certified firearms instructors from absolute liability under limited circumstances for the following reasons:

First, the provision was adopted by the 2012 legislature with significant supporting testimony, very limited opposing testimony and almost unanimous support by the House and Senate members who voted on the bill. No event has occurred in Hawaii since the adoption of Act 301 of the 2012 Legislature which would cause the wisdom of the law to be questioned. Accordingly, adopting the old adage, if it isn't broke, don't fix it. Until there is a reason to address this law, the law should be left in place.

Second, the exemption is very limited in scope. It is applicable only to (1) certified instructors (2) who provide instruction at a firing range (3) to persons who seek a permit to acquire a handgun. This is a very limited exemption which should have the effect of increasing the number of certified instructors who can provide the instruction that the legislature deems necessary for the acquisition of handguns.

Thank you for allowing me the opportunity to testify in opposition to HB 426.

My name is Russel Yamashita and I appreciate the opportunity to testify in opposition of House Bill 426 Relating to Firearms. IN STRONG OPPOSITION

Hon. Chair, Co-Chair, Members,

History: HRS §663-9.5 (d) in 2008 was amended, exempting the counties from absolute liability when an enforcement officer uses his gun "outside of the course and scope of employment as a law enforcement officer" showing that the counties were worried about government liability for a police officer's gun when he was in possession, because the gun is owned by the county. The amendment was proposed after an off duty Maui PD used his duty pistol to kill his wife. Former State Senator and Judiciary Chair Andy Levin testified for the Mayor of Maui. The plaintiff bar supported it as did HRA. We discussed a possible similar bill for NRA Instructors teaching the state-mandated safety course with the plaintiff bar representative at that time, and in 2009 a limited immunity bill was introduced, opposed by the plaintiff bar, but eventually passing last year. We are disappointed that it is challenged again so soon.

We are also disappointed in the referral for this bill. The issue is about teaching the public firearms safety. Why was the PBS Committee bypassed?

The NRA classes are quite low risk. The only injury in the class seen with any frequency is staple cuts from stapling targets to cardboard. Over the many years and thousands of graduates since the State mandated training, I am aware of no injuries requiring an emergency room visit and certainly no gunshot wounds. NRA instruction nationally has the same very low incidence of injury, and shooting as a sport is very safe. As an example, my personal insurance coverage for teaching shooting lessons is \$120 per year for a \$250,000 liability policy. The current statute does not take much business away from personal injury lawyers. There are fewer than 100 NRA instructors active in Hawaii.

The limited liability provided under the current language relieves instructors of the special absolute liability created by HRS663-9.5, but they could still be sued in ordinary actions for negligence.

As an NRA Certified Senior Training Counselor, I can assure you that the classes mandated as a requirement for application for a handgun permit under HRS 134.2 and conducted by NRA Certified Instructors and Training Counselors are designed by extremely capable national level firearms educators, many with a law enforcement or military background. The classes are highly structured, as safe as humanly possible, and carefully assessed and periodically updated by the NRA Training Department in Fairfax, Virginia, Training Counselors in Hawaii, and local Instructors themselves. Instructor candidates are experienced gun owners and shooters preselected using strict pre-qualification guidelines and hands-on testing for safe handling including live fire. The Basic Pistol Instructor training course is 2 days of intensive instruction in teaching

methods, and hands-on instruction of beginning students in nomenclature, safety, parts and operation, ammunition, the basics of dry-firing, firearms laws, and live fire, safe storage, range safety, and proper maintenance of firearms. To be certified they must demonstrate throughout the course the required knowledge, skills, and attitude required to teach basic handgun skills to beginning shooters, and pass a 50-question written test with a 95% score. Certified Instructors must report their instructor activity to NRA Training Department within 10 days of every class. Inactive Instructors lose their certification and must re-train. As well as Basic Pistol classes, NRA Instructors may also be certified to teach NRA classes in Rifle, Shotgun, Muzzleloading Rifles, Pistols and Shotguns, Personal Protection Inside the Home, Personal Reloading Ammunition, and Range Safety Officer. They teach Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, FFA programs, child safety programs (Eddie Eagle) and community crime prevention courses (Refuse to Be a Victim). NRA's Law Enforcement Training and Coaching Divisions are separate.

Under the current statute, the gun owner is "absolutely liable" and can only raise an affirmative defense that the firearm was not in his possession. This means that at the very least, an instructor could be forced to defend a civil suit to make the argument that he didn't possess the gun. In many cases, that argument would fail because, the law recognizes the possibility of constructive possession without direct physical control. The Hawaii courts frequently cite Black's Law Dictionary:

"A person who knowingly has direct physical control over a thing at a given time is then in actual possession of it. A person who, although not in actual possession, knowingly has both the power and the intention at a given time to exercise dominion over a thing, either directly or through another person or persons, is then in constructive possession of it."

In all the Basic classes mandated for permits, the Instructors furnish their own firearms for the students to use. In such an NRA class where the instructor is supposed to direct the students as to exactly what they're supposed to be doing with the guns at any given time, an instructor certainly could be held to be in constructive possession of the guns at all times.

State v. Taylor, 2011 ICA No. 28904; CR. No. 07–1–0253). Intermediate Court of Appeals RECKTENWALD, C.J., NAKAYAMA, DUFFY, and McKENNA, JJ., with ACOBA, J., concurring and dissenting separately. This was a recent case about who possessed stolen Hawaiian artifacts. Also:

The affirmative defense for non-possession only applies if the firearm wasn't in the owner's possession because it was stolen. Under existing language, the elements of subsection (b) are connected by an "and," meaning that they all have to apply for the affirmative defense to be valid. The second and third elements of subsection (b) both indicate the defense only applies

when the firearm was taken without the owner's permission and the owner either reported the "theft" to police or would not have discovered the theft in the exercise of reasonable care at the time of the incident giving rise to liability.

We recommend you replace the language of this bill with the language in SB 248, extending the immunity to classroom situations not on an actual shooting range, the preferred circumstances for instructing the didactic and dry-fire portions of the classes.
