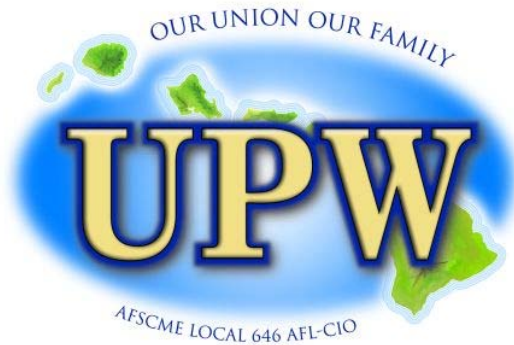
MAKING EMERGENCY APPROPRIATIONS FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING COST ITEMS

House Bill No. 833, H.D. 1, appropriates and authorizes funds for collective bargaining cost items for arbitrated settlement for collective Bargaining Unit 10 and their excluded counterparts for Fiscal Biennium 2011-13.

The Department of Budget and Finance supports this Administration proposal which was amended to reflect the costs of the actual award. Interest arbitration proceedings were held in November 2012 and an arbitration award was received on January 10, 2013. The award included no wage reductions for the entire contract period and a 3.2% across the board increase beginning January 16, 2013. The Governor submitted these cost items to the Legislature on January 28, 2013, pursuant to Section 89-11, HRS.

Please note that while the arbitration panel cannot make an award concerning Employer-Union Trust contributions, Section 89-11(g) requires the employer to submit its recommendation for contributions to the Legislature. Section 89-11(g) states that the parties shall submit their recommendations for contributions to the Legislature and that the final and binding agreement of the parties on all provisions shall consist of the panel's decision and the amounts of contributions established by the Legislature by enactment, after the Legislature has considered the recommendations for such contributions by the parties. Senate Bill No. 1057, S.D. 2, is a separate Administration bill addressing this matter.

We would like to bring to your attention that collective bargaining appropriations for the Hawaii Health Systems Corporation (HHSC) are usually made directly to HHSC. We recommend correcting the program ID in parts VI and VII from BUF 101 to HTH 210.
