This testimony is in support of HCR57 relating to Family-School Partnerships.

The Hui for Excellence in Education (HE'E) is a diverse coalition of over 40 parent and community organizations dedicated to improving student achievement by increasing family and community engagement and partnerships in our schools. Our member list is attached.

For the last two sessions, the legislature passed SCR145 and SCR79, respectively, which requested that the DOE, with input from community organizations, to establish, implement, and monitor statewide policies for family engagement in Hawaii's public schools. In Hawai'i, we operate the federally funded Hilopa'a Family to Family Health Information Center and are the Medicaid Ombudsman. A hallmark of the last year has been the collaborative effort between the DOE and family/communication organizations in developing draft policy statement the "Family-School Partnership Policy". This work is not complete and it would benefit our larger school community if the partners involved were able to complete the tasks to finalize the policy and see the effort completed through its adoption by the Board of Education and the development of corollary operational guidelines.
