Testimony in SUPPORT of SB 1082, Relating to Transportation of School Children

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony. The Board of Education SUPPORTS SB 1082.

In light of the escalating costs of student transportation in Hawaii, it was incumbent upon the Board of Education and the Department of Education to appropriately assess the situation. To that end, the Department engaged a leading student bus transportation consultant to take a comprehensive look at the current situation and develop a viable program of improvement for immediate action.

The amendments to the current law, as stated in SB 1082, are a result of the consultant's recommendations contained in its November 2012, Student Bus Transportation Study Final Report. Accordingly, the Board supports this measure as we believe it will allow the Department to more effectively manage the contracting process which will in turn assist the Department in managing the provision of services and cost.
