SB 1124, SD1, Relating to the Dietitian Licensure Special Fund

Testimony of Loretta J. Fuddy, A.C.S.W., M.P.H.

1 **Department's Position:** Strong Support.

2 **Fiscal Implications:** Decreases General Fund dependency.

3 **Purpose and Justification:** This bill is part of the Governor's Administrative Package. SB 1124 SD1
4 is a housekeeping bill that establishes expenditure limits necessary for the department to expend these
5 funds to offset operational costs. Current statute does not adequately identify expenditure limits.

7 The Dietitian Licensure Special Fund is an existing fund into which fees for profession licensing are
8 deposited. The State's dietitian licensure program was implemented by the department in August 2012
9 and issued licenses to 30 dietitians as of January 15, 2013, with more applications in process. Licensure
10 fees totaling \$7,825 were collected and deposited in the Special Fund during this time. Once this bill
11 becomes law, the department will be able to expend moneys in support of the licensure program.
