TO THE HONORABLE DAVID Y.IGE, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Catherine Awakuni, and I am the Cable Television Administrator at the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs (the “**Department**”). The Department appreciates the opportunity to express **support for the intent** of S.B. No. 2981 S.D. 2, which amends the State Plan’s policies, objectives and priority guidelines to promote and encourage an innovative economy.

The Department is one of three lead agencies supporting the Hawaii Broadband Initiative (HBI) to provide statewide access to affordable, high speed broadband services. The Department is also charged by statute with responsibilities related to the advancement of broadband infrastructure in the State. Both the HBI and the Hawaii Broadband Task Force, formed by the Legislature in 2007, recognize that the development of world-class broadband communications infrastructure is vital to the future of our State’s economy and to the health, welfare and quality of life of all of our residents.

S.B. No. 2981 furthers the State’s forward-looking vision to achieve world class broadband communication for all residents and businesses in Hawaii and to attract technology related industry to the State. The bill also further promotes the streamlining of government processes and access to infrastructure to facilitate these objectives. The Department thus strongly supports the intent of this bill, which will among other things guide policy and action to drive broadband deployment.
