#### TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL NO. 548, RELATING TO TELEMEDICINE.

TO THE HONORABLE ROSALYN H. BAKER, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Danny M. Takanishi, Jr. and I am the Chairperson of the Hawaii Medical Board ("Board"). The Board thanks you for the opportunity to testify on this measure.

The Board supports this bill with the exception of the inclusion of "behavioral health professionals". This term is not defined and the Board feels that it may lead some to believe that professionals such as social workers, psychologists, marriage and family therapists, etc. are exempt from the licensing law. If exempt, these non-physicians would then be allowed to practice telemedicine as provided for in Hawaii Revised Statutes Section 453-1.3. This provision clearly sets out guidelines for physicians and their patients in the practice of medicine and exempting non-physicians would, in essence, allow them to practice medicine.

Furthermore, the Board is not aware that this group can be credentialed by a hospital.

For the reasons above, the Board requests that "behavioral health professional" be deleted from the bill.

TO THE HONORABLE ROSALYN H. BAKER, CHAIR, AND MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE:

My name is Carol Nowak, Ph.D., Chairperson of the Hawaii Board of Psychology ("Board"). The Board had an opportunity to review this bill at its meeting on February 15, 2013, and would like to provide the following comments.

In particular, the Board would like clarification as to what constitutes a "behavioral health professional" as referenced in Section 2 of the bill. The Board is under the impression that a "behavioral health professional" may include, but not be limited to psychologists, social workers, mental health counselors, marriage and family therapists, etc. If this is the case, these behavioral health professionals are not regulated under Hawaii Revised Statutes Chapter 453. As such, it would not be appropriate to refer to "behavioral health specialists" in this bill.
