SENATE BILL NO. 5 SD 1 RELATING TO PUBLIC LANDS

Chairperson Luke and Members of the Committee:

Thank you for the opportunity to testify on Senate Bill No. 5 SD1. The purpose of this bill is to provide several means of compensation in addition to rent reductions when the State withdraws, condemns, or takes public land leased for intensive agricultural or pastoral uses and renders the land unusable for the original purposes of the lease. The department supports the intent of this bill.

In the face of rising costs for agricultural inputs, our local livestock producers are finding it increasingly difficult to remain profitable. The Department is in support of any measure that will help to support our local ranchers remain successful.

The Department recognizes that language in this bill reflects a compromise that was made during the 2012 Legislative Session between the Legislature and the Department of Land and Natural Resources.

Comments: SB 5 amends HRS 171 to allow for fair market value compensation for livestock displaced when a lease is prematurely terminated or parts thereof are withdrawn. HRS 171 currently allows for fair market compensation for other agricultural crop losses but not grazing livestock. As written HRS 171 treats livestock as if they can be liquidated for fair market value at a livestock market. However, there are no livestock markets in Hawaii and livestock not sold private treaty live can only be salvaged at cull value at slaughter facilities for a fraction of their market value. SB 5 as written corrects this shortfall and places livestock on an even field with other agricultural commodities. This shortfall nearly put our family ranch out of business when 1/3 of our lease was withdrawn and 30% of our cattle had to be sold at cull value. Please prevent this from happening again with this amendment.

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
