Chair Espero, Vice Chair Baker and Members of the Committee:

My name is Alan Gottlieb, and I am a rancher and the GovernmentA ffairs Chair for the Hawaii Cattlemen's Council. The Hawaii Cattlemen's Council, Inc. (HCC) is the Statewide umbrella organization comprised of the five county level Cattlemen's Associations. Our 130+ member ranchers represent over 60,000 head of beef cows; more than 75% of all the beef cows in the State. Ranchers are the stewards of approximately 25% of the State's total land mass.

The Hawaii Cattlemen's Council strongly supports SB 727.

While we agree that counties should have strong "home rule", we also believe that when Counties adopt ordinances that conflict with accepted Federal and State laws, rules or regulations, this adds an additional level of bureaucracy which is redundant and burdensome. Imagine businesses which operate in more than one county in our State having to follow separate rules for their business. In this era of activism and misinformation rampant ins ocial media and ont he internet, generally accepted farming practices are especially susceptible to folks who simply don't like what you do, even though those practices are regulated and perhaps even endorsed by Federal Agencies and/or State Departments.
