### In consideration of Senate Bill No. 814 Relating to State Low-Income Public Housing

Honorable Chairs and Members of the Senate Committees on Human Services and Economic Development, Government Operations and Housing, thank you for the opportunity to provide you with comments regarding Senate Bill (S.B.) No. 814, relating to state low-income public housing.

The Hawaii Public Housing Authority (HPHA) <u>supports</u> the enactment of this measure, which would allow law enforcement officers who would not otherwise be eligible for occupancy in the state low-income public housing projects, to reside in a state low-income public housing dwelling unit to increase security for the residents of that public housing community.

Currently, 24 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) §960.505 allows law enforcement officers to reside in our Federal low-income public housing communities. The HPHA believes that by allowing law enforcement officers to reside in our state low-incoming public housing communities, they would greatly reduce criminal activity on the HPHA's properties through immediate arrest and prosecution capacity, and would further increase the safety of our state low-income public housing communities.

The HPHA appreciates the opportunity to provide the Senate Committees on Human Services, and Public Safety, Intergovernmental and Military Affairs with the agency's position regarding S.B. No. 814. We respectfully request the Committee to pass this measure favorably, and we thank you very much for your dedicated support.
