Congratulations to Kaleiopu'u Elementary School for being awarded funds for these capital improvement projects;

- \$550,000 – Kaleiopuu Elementary School, Oahu – Construction to provide various electrical system upgrades to provide ample power infrastructure to support technology-based curriculum

Safety Alert

Hawaiian Electric Company would like to warn the public about a potential scam happening to customers. Individuals have been impersonating HECO staff either in person or on the phone. Some customers have received telephone calls from individuals who tell them their electric bills are delinquent, and service will be disconnected unless payment is made in a particular manner. In some cases, impersonators have even gone to customers' homes and threatened to disconnect their electric services unless they were paid. HECO would like to provide these safety tips;

- When responding to phone calls, never provide personal, confidential or financial information
- If approached by individuals from HECO ask for their company identification.
- Make note of the vehicle the individuals are driving. HECO vehicles are clearly marked.

If you feel uncertain and want to confirm that a HECO employee is visiting your home or business, call the customer service center at 548-7311. If you notice any suspicious activity, call 911 and also please report to HECO.
