More for Agriculture

Senator Dela Cruz received a communication from the Governor informing him that funds are being released for the following project in Central Oahu. Senator Dela Cruz was pleased to be informed of this as this is another component of the Whitmore Plan that is needed to support those farmers who will be farming on the Galbraith lands the state recently acquired.

State Packing and Processing Facility -\$3,500,000 for a state packing and processing facility. The projected facility is on a 24-acre parcel located in Whitmore Village on lands currently owned by the Castle & Cooke Company. Last year, the State finalized the sale of 1,700+ acres of prime farm land known as the Galbraith Estate. With the State moving closer to finalizing the transaction to add another 24 acres, the infrastructure and warehouse facilities currently on these lands will assist farmers with storage, processing, and packaging and will be another step to having the Whitmore Plan implemented. Senator Dela Cruz stated that each step will bring reality of agricultural revival in Central Oahu that much closer. The goal is to increase agricultural productivity and make the state less dependent on imported food.



Transportation Improvements

Senator Michelle Kidani, Representative Ryan Yamane and Senator Dela Cruz held a transportation town hall meeting recently in Mililani to discuss various transportation issues with the pertinent departments. The big news for Mililani residents is the resurfacing of streets. Work will be done in three sections-lower Mililani (below Kamehameha Highway), middle Mililani (Mililani Town) and upper (Mauka)-and is expected to start later this year. Contracts have been awarded and the entire project will take approximately one and a half years to complete. The last road to be done will be Meheula Parkway as it has extensive damage caused by tree roots and will involve a different approach to resurfacing. Various other issues were addressed and updates given which will be addressed in another issue of the newsletter.
