## **Application for Grants and Subsidies**

### **I. Background and Summary**

#### **1. A brief description of the Applicant's background:**

The Pahoa Booster Club was formed as a result of community requests to assist all Pahoa Regional Schools and their athletic programs. Kalani Honua Inc. has agreed to act as a fiscally sponsoring 501(c)(3) non-profit organization for the Pahoa Booster Club. Kalani Honua Inc. has been serving the lower Puna District as a public charity since 1987.

There was a Booster Club several years ago and, since its dissolution, sports such as football have become non-existent or are floundering with little community support. This Booster Club is meant to renew a much-needed home-town spirit and help sports programs at both regular DOE and charter schools to foster the community support they desperately need to thrive. The Pahoa Booster Club has made the resurrection of a football program at Pahoa High and Intermediate School its immediate priority and is seeking from the State Legislature through its grant-in-aid process, the necessary startup funds. (See attached financial information)

#### **2. The goals and objectives related to the request:**

The Pahoa Booster Club seeks to resurrect the Pahoa High and Intermediate School, which ceased existence in 2001. The grant-in-aid request is specifically for equipment and personnel necessary for the initial startup of an 8-man football team, along with one-year operating expenses.

#### **3. The public purpose and need to be served:**

Pahoa is the Regional Town Center for the lower Puna District on the Big Island known for its low cost of living and accompanying low socio-economic status. Puna is a rural area, being 17 miles from Hilo. Students in this area may come from poor backgrounds and also have limited transportation out of Puna. The fact that Pahoa does not currently have a football program means that a student seeking to pursue such a sport has to transfer to another school, namely Kea'au, Waiakea or Hilo. If their parent(s) do not have the economic means to transport the student, he will have to rely on public transportation. The Mass Transit Agency here on the Big Island is not ideal and new bus routes are continually being added for its improvement. But it would be a challenge for student in rural Puna seeking to attend school in Kea'au or Hilo to rely on this form of transportation. With so many odds against the student, he will be unable to play football at any school.

Pahoa Booster Club is seeking to provide students in the lower Puna area the opportunity to play football for their hometown. Pahoa Booster Club members and the greater community (see attached lists of people who support football in Pahoa) believe that a football program for Pahoa

will help with community building. There is nothing like a hometown football game. People show up in their school colors, they chant their alma mater, they congregate, and they cheer for their children, grandchildren, neighbors and friends. There are other sports that may draw a crowd, but nothing draws a crowd more than football.

**4. Describe the target population to be served:**

The target population will be all high school students in the Puna area within the 96778 zip code area, which includes all Pahoia Schools including Charter Schools, and specifically those seeking to play eight-man football in Pahoia.

**5. Describe the geographic area:**

Pahoia is approximately the geographic center of the Puna District on Hawai'i Island. The 96778 region is perhaps the highest poverty rate, highest Hawaiian population and the most underserved area in the State. It is also the fastest growing region in the State with a population that is expected to increase by 20+ percent per census for the next several cycles.

**II. Service Summary and Outcomes**

The Pahoia Booster Club intends to use requested funds for equipment necessary for an eight-man team, along with supplies for the trainers, field paint, player benches, repair of an existing scoreboard, along with expenses to hire game officials, ticket sellers, and to pay for buses to transport players to games in Kohala, Honokaa, and Ka'u.

The Pahoia Booster Club will track all expenses related to the Pahoia football program, along with the amount of game tickets sold. The club will document the players involved with the program and track their progress in school, cognizant to meet FERPA guidelines and not violate players' privacy, but intent to keep relevant statistics related to players and their performance in school before and after playing football. All of this will be included in a report to the Legislature after the completion of the first football season that is funded.

**1. Describe the scope of work, tasks and responsibilities:**

The money requested is specifically going to be used to start up the Pahoia football program and ensure its success for one year. Beyond that, the Pahoia Booster Club is committed to fundraising and assisting in helping Pahoia High and Intermediate School obtain the estimated \$15,000 (see attached) annually needed to keep the program going. The Pahoia Booster Club already has commitments from at least three businesses in the community — Ormat, or Puna Geothermal Venture, Island Naturals and Kapoho Kine Adventures to help financially sustain the football program. The Pahoia Booster Club is confident that the greater community will rally around the football program and, with solicitation from the Booster Club, will donate funds to ensure the sustainability of football in Pahoia. (Please see 181 signatures obtained in a two-week period.) The Booster Club is also confident that ticket sales will help with the annual operating costs. The Puna community seems to be very receptive to bringing back football, and will come out and pay a nominal fee to see an eight-man team play in Pahoia.

**2. Provide a projected annual timeline for accomplishing the results or outcomes of the service:**

Within one year of the Pahoia football program's startup, the Pahoia Booster Club will provide the Legislature with a report on the Pahoia football program's progress, including games played, money spent, and money raised through ticket sales and Pahoia Booster Club's fundraising.

**3. Describe its quality assurance and evaluation plans for the request. Specify how the Applicant plans to monitor, evaluate, and improve their results:**

The Pahoia Booster Club will keep track of the football program's players and how their grades are affected as a result of playing football. The Booster Club will also track money spent on the football program, how much money is raised in ticket sales, and how much money is raised through the fundraising efforts of the Booster Club. All of this will be relayed to the Legislature within one year of the receipt of startup funds. The Booster Club will also track the football program in subsequent years and note comparisons and correlations, similarities and differences, in order to be continually accountable to the Legislature and also to community donors.



The Booster Club is also working with the Puna Panthers intramural football team, which built that program from the ground up. The Booster Club is confident that once the groundwork is laid for an eight-man football team in Pahoia it will thrive with community support.

Pahoia Booster Club is working with the Hawaii Football Club and members of the highly successful intramural football team, the Puna Panthers, to get the Pahoia High and Intermediate School underway. Community members such as Kaipō Like, of Puna Panthers; CPA Nancy Kramer; businessman Ned Harris, Jimmy Brown, Shawn Correa Doll, graduate and record-holding athlete of Kamehameha Schools, former Pahoia athletic director Lillian Salazar and her husband George Salazar; Hawai'i State Representative Faye Hanohano and her husband Haimi; Leslie K.J. Julian; and community volunteers Madie Greene, Mark Hinshaw, Kaleo Francisco, and Tiffany Edwards Hunt are among those committed to seeing the Pahoia football program start up and sustain itself. Pahoia High and Intermediate School principal Darlene Bee has attended every Pahoia Booster Club meetings, committed to supporting the Pahoia football program once startup funds are obtained. Mike Kaleikini, of Puna Geothermal Venture, has also attended Pahoia Booster Club meetings and pledged his support for the football program, along with a promise that his parent company, Ormat, would help to keep the program going after its initial startup.

The Pahoia community has formed the Pahoia Booster Club for benefit of athletics at all of the Pahoia Regional schools. Our immediate goal is to support the Pahoia High and Intermediate School's quest to restore a football program.

The capital expenditure start-up costs are estimated to be \$80,000 and the annual operational costs are estimated to be \$15,000. (See attachment.) We have commitments from key corporations in our community — Ormat (Puna Geothermal Venture); Kapoho Kine Adventures; and Island Naturals — and this organization is prepared to solicit donations from others to help sustain the football program after its initial startup.

Pahoia Booster Club has the full support and commitment of the administration and athletic department of the Pahoia High and Intermediate School and Hawaii Academy of Arts and Sciences Public Charter School.
