
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that hiring students at
2 universities benefits both the student and the university. The
3 students have the ability to earn income as they are learning
4 from their jobs either on-campus or off-campus. Many campus
5 programs are highly dependent on entry level, as well as
6 experienced and specialized, flexible employee staff. At the
7 University of Hawaii, approximately four thousand students work
8 an average of twelve hours per week while enrolled as a full-
9 time student. These student-employees depend on part-time work
10 to help pay for tuition, educational, and living expenses. The
11 University of Hawaii spends approximately \$22,000,000 system-
12 wide for undergraduate and graduate student employees, funded by
13 general funds, tuition and fees, and federal work-study funds.

14 The purpose of this Act is to provide funds for the
15 University of Hawaii to pay student employee salaries at new or
16 expanded worksites at each campus and for three full-time
17 equivalent support staff for the vice chancellor for students at
18 the University of Hawaii at Manoa.



1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$. or so much
 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
 4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
 5 2014-2015 to: hire three full-time equivalent (3.0 FTE) support
 6 staff to assist the vice chancellor for students at the
 7 University of Hawaii at Manoa with the coordination,
 8 recruitment, training, and compliance with system-wide
 9 procedures and student employment regulations; and pay student
 10 employee salaries for new or expanded worksites at each
 11 University of Hawaii campus; provided that:


- 12 (1) The vice chancellor for students at each University of
 13 Hawaii campus shall be allocated funds according to
 14 full-time student enrollment; and
- 15 (2) Priority shall be given to students working on
 16 university programs supporting access, retention, and
 17 diversity.

18 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the University
 19 of Hawaii for the purposes of this Act.

20 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
