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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NET ENERGY METERING.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

- 1       SECTION 1. (a) The public utilities commission shall  
2       conduct a study on existing net energy metering contracts with  
3       customer-generators that examines:
- 4           (1) The value of the electricity generated by residential  
5           eligible customer-generators that enters the grid;
- 6           (2) The costs associated with the upgrades required to the  
7           grid to enable residential eligible customer-  
8           generators to connect to the grid;
- 9           (3) The feasibility of providing residential eligible  
10          customer-generators with the option of receiving  
11          compensation for any unused credits for excess  
12          electricity from the eligible customer-generator that  
13          is fed back to the grid and the potential rate of  
14          compensation for the excess electricity; and
- 15          (4) The feasibility of allowing unused credits for excess  
16          electricity produced by residential eligible customer-  
17          generators and fed back to the grid to carry over to  
18          subsequent years.



1 (b) No later than twenty days prior to the convening of  
2 the regular session of 2015, the public utilities commission  
3 shall submit to the legislature a written report of its findings  
4 and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, with  
5 regard to its examination of net energy metering as described in  
6 subsection (a).

7 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
