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# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE JUDICIARY.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

1           SECTION 1. This Act shall be known and may be cited as the  
2 Judiciary Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2014.

3           SECTION 2. Act 133, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, is  
4 amended by amending part II to read as follows:

5                               **"PART II. PROGRAM APPROPRIATIONS**

6           SECTION 3. The following sums, or so much thereof as may  
7 be sufficient to accomplish the purposes and programs designated  
8 herein, are appropriated or authorized from the sources of  
9 funding specified to the judiciary for the fiscal biennium  
10 beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30, 2015. The total  
11 expenditures and the number of permanent positions established  
12 in each fiscal year of the fiscal biennium shall not exceed the  
13 sums and the position ceilings indicated for each year, except  
14 as provided in this Act.

1 SECTION 3. Act 133, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, is  
2 amended by adding six new sections to part III to read as  
3 follows:

4 SECTION 6.1. Provided that of the general fund  
5 appropriation for the first judicial circuit (JUD 310), the  
6 sum of \$50,799 or so much thereof as may be necessary for  
7 fiscal year 2014-2015 shall be expended for a grant-in-aid  
8 to the department of the prosecuting attorney of the city  
9 and county of Honolulu for prosecution in veterans court,  
10 including the hiring of necessary staff; provided further  
11 that the funds shall not be expended for any other purpose;  
12 and provided further that any unexpended funds shall lapse  
13 into the general fund.

14 SECTION 6.2. Provided that of the general fund  
15 appropriation for the first judicial circuit (JUD 310), the  
16 sum of \$107,788 or so much thereof as may be necessary for  
17 fiscal year 2014-2015 shall be expended for a grant-in-aid  
18 to the department of the prosecuting attorney of the city  
19 and county of Honolulu for prosecution in drug court,  
20 including the hiring of necessary staff; provided further  
21 that the funds shall not be expended for any other purpose;  
22 and provided further that any unexpended funds shall lapse



1 into the general fund.

2 SECTION 6.3. Provided that of the general fund  
3 appropriation for the first judicial circuit (JUD 310), the  
4 sum of \$337,244 or so much thereof as may be necessary for  
5 fiscal year 2014-2015 shall be expended for a grant-in-aid  
6 to the department of the prosecuting attorney of the city  
7 and county of Honolulu for Hawaii's opportunity probation  
8 with enforcement program (HOPE), including the hiring of  
9 necessary staff; provided further that the funds shall not  
10 be expended for any other purpose; and provided further  
11 that any unexpended funds shall lapse into the general  
12 fund.

13 SECTION 6.4. Provided that of the general fund  
14 appropriation for the first judicial circuit (JUD 310), the  
15 sum of \$365,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary for  
16 fiscal year 2014-2015 shall be expended for a statewide  
17 established temporary restraining order assistance program  
18 targeted to support the family court system of the first  
19 circuit in assisting victims of abuse with obtaining  
20 temporary restraining orders in a timely manner; provided  
21 further that the funds shall not be expended for any other  
22 purpose; and provided further that any unexpended funds



1 shall lapse into the general fund.

2 SECTION 6.5. Provided that of the general fund  
3 appropriation for the third judicial circuit (JUD 330), the  
4 sum of \$53,364 or so much thereof as may be necessary for  
5 fiscal year 2014-2015 shall be expended to establish one  
6 full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) permanent exempt program  
7 attorney position to support the third judicial circuit in  
8 matters of mortgage foreclosures, administrative support  
9 for judges, and general court operations.

10 SECTION 6.6. Provided that of the general fund  
11 appropriation for the administration (JUD 601), the sum of  
12 \$107,640 or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year  
13 2014-2015 shall be expended to establish one full-time  
14 equivalent (1.00 FTE) permanent exempt special assistant to the  
15 administrative director of the courts position to provide  
16 executive staff support to the administrative director of the  
17 courts and the chief justice of the Hawaii supreme court in the  
18 creation and implementation of the state judiciary's 2020  
19 strategic plan, producing studies and analysis of court and  
20 administrative matters, representing the administration on  
21 various committees, and to work with private and government  
22 agencies to increase the accessibility of the courts."



1 SECTION 4. Act 133, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, is  
2 amended by amending part IV to read as follows:

3 "PART IV. CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

4 SECTION 7. The sum of [~~\$14,825,000~~] \$104,015,000  
5 appropriated or authorized in part II of this Act for capital  
6 improvement projects shall be expended by the judiciary for the  
7 projects listed below; provided that several related or similar  
8 projects may be combined into a single project, if a combination  
9 is advantageous or convenient for implementation; and provided  
10 further that the total cost of the projects thus combined shall  
11 not exceed the total of the sums specified for the projects  
12 separately. The amount after each cost element and the total  
13 funding for each project listed in this part [~~are~~] is in  
14 thousands of dollars.

1 SECTION 5. Act 133, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, is  
2 amended by amending part V to read as follows:

3 "PART V. ISSUANCE OF BONDS

4 SECTION 8. General obligation bonds may be issued, as  
5 provided by law, to yield the amount that may be necessary to  
6 finance projects authorized in part II and listed in part IV of  
7 this Act; provided that the sum total of the general obligation  
8 bonds so issued shall not exceed [~~\$14,825,000.~~] \$104,015,000."

9 SECTION 6. If any portion of this Act or its application  
10 to any person or circumstances is held to be invalid for any  
11 reason, the remainder of the Act and any provision thereof shall  
12 not be affected. If any portion of a specific appropriation is  
13 held to be invalid for any reason, the remaining portion shall  
14 be independent of the invalid portion and shall be expended to  
15 fulfill the objective and intent of the appropriation to the  
16 extent possible.

17 SECTION 7. If any manifest clerical, typographical, or  
18 other mechanical error is found in this Act, the chief justice  
19 is authorized to correct the error. All changes made pursuant  
20 to this section shall be reported to the legislature at its next  
21 regular session.



1 SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
