
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SANDALWOOD.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 183, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new part to be appropriately designated and
3 to read as follows:

4 "PART . SANDALWOOD

5 §183-A Duties; sandalwood. In addition to the duties
6 listed in section 183-1.5, the department shall:

7 (1) Support reforestation efforts throughout the State for
8 all native sandalwood species with the objective of
9 replenishing native sandalwood species forests to the
10 level at which those forests existed prior to 1800;

11 (2) Provide incentives to local entrepreneurs to cultivate
12 native sandalwood species in plantations for either
13 reforestation programs or commercial operations;

14 (3) Provide support for programs that ensure the
15 sustainability of commercial sandalwood operations in
16 the State; and

17 (4) Enforce penalties against persons who violate this
18 part.



1 **§183-B Destruction or harvesting of sandalwood trees.** (a)

2 It shall be unlawful to destroy or harvest a tree of a native
3 sandalwood species that is determined by the department to have
4 been in existence prior to the year 1778.

5 (b) It shall be unlawful to destroy or harvest a tree of a
6 native sandalwood species not described in subsection (a)
7 without a license issued by the department.

8 (c). Any person who destroys or harvests a native
9 sandalwood species tree shall replant native sandalwood species
10 trees in an amount equal to the total estimated age of all trees
11 destroyed or harvested; provided that the department shall
12 monitor the replanting efforts and the success rate of the
13 seedlings that are replanted.

14 (d) It shall be unlawful to export raw or unprocessed
15 timber of any native sandalwood species outside the State.

16 **§183-C Fees.** (a) Any person licensed pursuant to section
17 183-B(b) who harvests trees of a native sandalwood species for
18 commercial purposes shall pay to the department a fee equal to
19 per cent of the dollar value of the sandalwood or
20 sandalwood products harvested or sold.

21 (b) All fees collected pursuant to subsection (a) shall be
22 deposited in the treasury of the State for use by the department



1 for forestry purposes and all such sums as may be so collected
2 and deposited are appropriated for those purposes.

3 §183-D Criminal penalties. Any person who violates
4 section 183-B, upon conviction thereof, is guilty of a
5 misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than \$ or
6 imprisoned not more than one year, or both. In addition to any
7 other penalty imposed under this section, a fine of up to
8 \$ shall be levied for each tree illegally destroyed or
9 harvested under section 183-B."


10 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
11 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
12 begun before its effective date.

13 SECTION 3. In codifying the new sections added by section
14 1 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute
15 appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating
16 the new sections in this Act.

17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
