A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 302A-1159, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

2 amended to read as follows:

3 "§302A-1159 Physical [examination] and dental examinations

4 required. No child shall [be admitted to] attend any school for

5 the first time in the State unless the child presents to the

6 appropriate school official a report from a licensed physician

7 or advanced practice registered nurse of the results of a

8 physical examination, and a report from a licensed dentist of a

9 dental examination, performed within a year of the date of entry

10 into school. A child may [enter] attend school provisionally

11 upon submitting written documentation from a licensed physician,

12 advanced practice registered nurse, <u>licensed dentist</u>, or other

authorized representative of the department of health stating

14 that the child is in the process of undergoing a physical or

15 dental examination. Further documentation showing that the

16 required physical [examination has] and dental examinations have

17 been completed shall be submitted to the appropriate school

- 1 official no later than three months after the child first
- 2 [entered] attended the school."
- 3 SECTION 2. Section 302A-1160, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended to read as follows:
- 5 "§302A-1160 Student's health record. The department of
- 6 education shall provide student health record forms for
- 7 immunization and physical [examination] and dental examinations
- 8 to the schools, private physicians, advanced practice registered
- 9 nurses, private dentists, and authorized personnel of the
- 10 department of health."
- 11 SECTION 3. Section 302A-1161, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 12 amended to read as follows:
- 13 "§302A-1161 Notification for noncompliance. If a child
- 14 does not complete the immunizations required under section 302A-
- 15 1154 or the physical [examination] and dental examinations
- 16 required under section 302A-1159 within the [period] periods
- 17 provided by [section] sections 302A-1155 and 302A-1159 after
- 18 provisional entry into school, the administrator of the school
- 19 shall cause a notice to be sent to the parent or quardian of the
- 20 child stating that if the required immunizations or physical
- 21 [examination is] and dental examinations are not completed

- 1 within [thirty] ninety days of the date of the notice, the child
- 2 shall not be admitted to school."
- 3 SECTION 4. Section 302A-1162, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 4 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:
- 5 "(a) The department of health shall adopt rules under
- 6 chapter 91 relating to immunization, physical [examination,] and
- 7 dental examinations, and tuberculin testing under sections 302A-
- 8 1154 to 302A-1163. Immunizations required, and the manner and
- 9 frequency of their administration, shall conform with recognized
- 10 standard medical practices. The list of diseases and minimum
- 11 requirements for protection under sections 302A-1154 to 302A-
- 12 1163 may be revised whenever the department of health deems it
- 13 necessary for the protection of public health."
- 14 SECTION 5. (a) The board of education shall establish a
- 15 pilot program in one complex area of the board's choosing, under
- 16 which no child shall attend seventh grade unless the child
- 17 presents to the appropriate school official a report from a
- 18 licensed physician or advanced practice registered nurse of the
- 19 results of a physical examination performed within six months of
- 20 the first date of attendance.

1	(b) Commencing at the end of the students' sixth grade
2	year, the pilot program shall educate parents and students on
3	the:
4	(1) Physical examination requirements for seventh grade;
5	(2) Provider options; and
6	(3) Wellness visits and screenings as a health insurance
7	covered benefit under the federal Patient Protection
8	and Affordable Care Act.
9	Community stakeholders, including providers and health insurance
10	plans, may assist with the implementation of the sixth grade
11	educational component of the pilot program.
12	(c) The board of education shall allow a child to attend
13	school provisionally upon submitting written documentation from
14	a licensed physician, advanced practice registered nurse, or
15	other authorized representative of the department of health
16	stating that the child is in the process of undergoing a
17	physical examination required by the pilot program. If a child
18	is permitted to attend school provisionally, the board of

education shall require that further documentation showing that

- 1 (d) The pilot program shall begin with the 2015-2016
- 2 school year.
- 3 (e) The board of education shall submit a report of its
- 4 findings, recommendations, and proposed legislation, if any, to
- 5 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 6 of the regular session of 2016.
- 7 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
- 8 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 9 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to the
- 10 department of education to carry out the purposes of this Act.
- 11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 12 education for the purposes of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 15 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
