
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 302A-1164, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended as follows:

3 1. By amending subsections (a) and (b) to read:

4 "(a) The department shall permit:

5 (1) The self-administration of medication by a student for
6 asthma, anaphylaxis, or other potentially
7 life-threatening illnesses; and

8 (2) Department employees and agents to volunteer to
9 administer glucagon in an emergency situation to
10 students with diabetes[-] or administer auto-
11 injectable epinephrine in an emergency situation to
12 students with anaphylaxis.

13 (b) The student's parent or guardian shall provide the
14 department with:

15 (1) Written authorization for the self-administration of
16 medication or the emergency administration of
17 glucagon[+] or auto-injectable epinephrine;



- 1 (2) In the case of self-administration of medication,
2 written certification from the student's physician,
3 advanced practice registered nurse, or physician
4 assistant stating that the student:
- 5 (A) Has asthma, anaphylaxis, or another potentially
6 life-threatening illness; and
- 7 (B) Is capable of, and has been instructed in, the
8 proper method of self-administration of
9 medication; and
- 10 (3) In the case of emergency administration of glucagon to
11 a student with diabetes[7] or epinephrine to a student
12 with anaphylaxis, written certification from the
13 student's physician, advanced practice registered
14 nurse, or physician assistant stating that the student
15 has medical orders that glucagon or epinephrine may be
16 administered by a volunteer."
- 17 2. By amending subsection (g) to read:
- 18 "(g) Any employee or agent who volunteers to administer
19 glucagon in an emergency situation to a student with diabetes or
20 epinephrine to a student in anaphylactic shock shall receive
21 instruction in the proper administration of glucagon or
22 injectable epinephrine by a qualified health care professional.



1 A "qualified health care professional" means a licensed
2 physician, physician assistant, advanced practice registered
3 nurse or registered nurse, or certified diabetes educator. The
4 student's parent or guardian shall supply the school with the
5 glucagon kit required to administer the glucagon[-] or with
6 injectable epinephrine supplies to administer epinephrine. The
7 school shall store the glucagon kit or epinephrine kit in a
8 secure but accessible location. The department may also make
9 arrangements to receive injectable epinephrine supplies from
10 injectable epinephrine manufacturers or suppliers."

11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
14 department of education to contract for instruction, training,
15 and related expenses required for compliance with this Act.

16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
17 education for the purposes of this Act.

18 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
19 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

20 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Education; Administration of Epinephrine; Appropriation

Authorizes Department of Education employees and agents with specified training to volunteer to administer epinephrine to a student with anaphylaxis. Allows the Department of Education to make arrangements to receive injectable epinephrine supplies from manufacturers and suppliers. Effective July 1, 2050.
