A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUNTING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the enhancement and 2 maintenance of public hunting opportunities is of critical 3 importance to the State. A coordinated effort involving 4 stakeholders is needed to prevent and offset the loss, 5 destruction, or degradation of public hunting areas on any 6 island of the State and expeditiously find replacement land for 7 hunting. 8 SECTION 2. Chapter 183D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 9 amended by adding two new sections to part I to be appropriately 10 designated and to read as follows: No net loss of public hunting areas. (a) The department shall make reasonable efforts to prevent the loss,

- 13 destruction, or degradation of public hunting areas on any
- 14 island of the State. The department, if possible, shall
- 15 preserve hunting land within public hunting areas that were
- 16 designated on the respective island as of January 1, 2014,
- 17 through a coordinated effort involving stakeholders.

3	efforts t	o acquire, restore, enhance, and manage public lands to
4	replace t	the unavailable land with land that:

7	(2)	To the greatest extent possible, is located within the
8		same geographic region and provides the same types of
9		hunting that the department allowed on the unavailable
10		land.

12	later tha	n twenty days prior to the convening of each regular
13	session a	n annual report that includes:
14	(1)	The acreage managed by the department open to public
15		hunting;
16	(2)	The acreage managed by the department that has been
17		closed to public hunting during the previous year and
18		the reasons for the closures;
19	(3)	An inventory of game bird and mammal populations in
20		public hunting areas and the current conditions of the
21		habitats in public hunting areas that support the game
22		bird and mammal populations; and

1	(4)	Efforts to acquire, restore, enhance, and manage	
2		public lands in accordance with subsection (b) to	
3		replace land within a public hunting area that becomes	
4		unavailable for hunting.	
5	<u>(d)</u>	For the purposes of this section, "public hunting	
6	area" sha	11 have the same meaning as defined in section 183D-4.	
7	<u>§183</u>	D- Hunting advisory commission. (a) There is	
8	establish	ed within the department a hunting advisory commission,	
9	which shall serve in an advisory capacity to the board. The		
10	commission shall consist of eleven members to be appointed by		
11	the governor in the manner provided in section 26-34.		
12	Membership on the advisory commission shall consist of two		
13	members of the department designated by the chairperson of the		
14	board, one member from the division of conservation and resource		
15	enforcement, one member of each county's hunting community, one		
16	member from the tourism industry, one member who is a scientist		
17	with expe	rtise in the field of mammalogy or ornithology, one	
18	member rep	presenting the endangered species recovery committee,	
19	and one me	ember possessing a background in native Hawaiian

- 1 entitled to reimbursement for necessary expenses while attending
- 2 meetings and while in the discharge of their duties.
- 3 (b) The commission shall advise the board on proposals to
- 4 enhance and maintain the quantity and quality of public hunting
- 5 areas.
- 6 (c) The commission shall also advise the board on any
- 7 matter affecting hunting, including proposed rules. The
- 8 commission may take testimony and acquire information as it
- 9 desires and shall communicate its findings and recommendations
- 10 to the board."
- 11 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
- 13 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
- 14 administrative expenses of the hunting advisory commission
- 15 established pursuant to section 2 of this Act.
- 16 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 17 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 18 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 19 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
