
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CYBERSECURITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that implementing
2 effective cybersecurity measures is a challenge faced by all
3 states. The legislature also finds that coordinating the
4 resources of the department of defense, the University of
5 Hawaii, and the office of information technology will help to
6 create educational programs to improve cybersecurity in the
7 State and develop responses to cyber-attacks.

8 The purpose of this Act is to establish the Hawaii
9 cybersecurity, economic, education, and infrastructure security
10 council to recommend improvements to the State's cybersecurity
11 and to develop methods for securing federal moneys to fund other
12 cybersecurity improvements.

13 SECTION 2. (a) There is established the Hawaii
14 cybersecurity, economic, education, and infrastructure security
15 council within the office of information technology for
16 administrative purposes.

17 (b) The council shall be composed of the following six
18 members or their designees:



- 1 (1) The chief information officer, who shall serve as the
2 chair;
- 3 (2) The director of business, economic development, and
4 tourism;
- 5 (3) The adjutant general;
- 6 (4) The chair of the University of Hawaii department of
7 information and computer sciences;
- 8 (5) A member of a private institution of higher learning
9 with knowledge of cybersecurity to be selected by the
10 chief information officer; and
- 11 (6) The vice president for military affairs of the chamber
12 of commerce of Hawaii.
- 13 (c) The members of the council shall serve without
14 compensation and shall not be reimbursed for expenses incurred
15 in the performance of their duties.
- 16 (d) The council shall:
- 17 (1) Meet at least quarterly; and
- 18 (2) Develop methods for:
- 19 (A) Improving the State's cybersecurity by using
20 existing resources;



1 (B) Improving the State's cybersecurity operations
2 through partnerships with private businesses,
3 government, and institutions of higher education;

4 (C) Examining specific actions to accelerate the
5 growth of cybersecurity as an industry in the
6 State;

7 (D) Securing federal moneys for cybersecurity
8 activities and related educational programs; and

9 (E) Partnering with the United States Pacific Command
10 and other military organizations to implement
11 infrastructure protection and redundancies and to
12 prevent cyber-attacks, warfare, and terrorism.

13 (e) The council may request the assistance of other
14 departments to carry out its duties.

15 (f) The council shall submit a report of its findings,
16 recommendations, and proposed legislation to the legislature, no
17 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular
18 session of 2015.

19 (g) For the purposes of this Act, "council" shall mean the
20 Hawaii cybersecurity, economic, education, and infrastructure
21 security council.


1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014;


