
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECYCLABLE MATERIALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The department of health shall develop and
2 implement a three-year recycling pilot program in west Oahu to
3 accept for recycling recyclable items that are currently not
4 easily recycled in Hawaii including:

- 5 (1) Polyvinyl chloride (#3 plastic);
- 6 (2) Low-density polyethylene (#4 plastic);
- 7 (3) Polypropylene (#5 plastic);
- 8 (4) Polystyrene (#6 plastic);
- 9 (5) Other plastics including bisphenol A, polycarbonate,
10 and Lexan (#7 plastics);
- 11 (6) Copy paper;
- 12 (7) Printer ink cartridges;
- 13 (8) Laser printer cartridges; and
- 14 (9) Disposable batteries.

15 (b) In developing and implementing the pilot program, the
16 department of health shall select a private operator based upon:

- 17 (1) A request for quotation;



1 (2) The amount of materials the operator proposes to
2 recycle;

3 (3) The ability of the operator to recycle the items in
4 subsection (a) with minimal fiscal impact; and

5 (4) Other criteria as determined by the director of
6 health.

7 (c) The program site shall be determined by the director
8 of health and may be operated on state property, private
9 property, or both.

10 (d) The department of health may accept and expend private
11 monetary donations to develop the pilot program required by this
12 Act; provided that any private moneys received and expended
13 shall be accounted for separately from public moneys
14 appropriated and expended pursuant to this Act.

15 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
16 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
17 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 to develop
18 and implement a three-year recycling pilot program for items
19 that are currently not easily recyclable in Hawaii.

20 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
21 health.









1 SECTION 3. The department of health shall submit interim
 2 reports on the pilot program to the legislature no later than
 3 twenty days prior to the convening of the regular sessions of
 4 2015 and 2016, and a final report to the legislature no later
 5 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
 6 of 2017. The reports shall include information and
 7 recommendations on the efficacy of and the donations, costs, and
 8 expenditures associated with the pilot program. The final
 9 report shall also include a recommendation on whether the pilot
 10 program should be made permanent. The reports may include
 11 proposed legislation to support or augment the recycling program
 12 established pursuant to this Act.

13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014, and
 14 shall be repealed on June 30, 2017.
