BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 342B-72, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended as follows:

6 (1) Establishing greenhouse gas emission limits applicable

11 greenhouse gas emissions in furtherance of achieving
12 the statewide greenhouse gas emissions limit; and

13 (2) Requiring the reporting and verification of statewide
14 greenhouse gas emissions and to monitor and enforce
15 compliance with this part[~~r~~

16 ~~to become operative beginning on January 1, 2012].~~

17 (b) The director, to the extent feasible to achieve the
18 statewide greenhouse gas emissions limit, [~~shall~~] may adopt


