A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO STATE CONTRACTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 103D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"S103D- Prohibition on contracting with contractors that
5	have committed fraud or certain other crimes. Notwithstanding
6	section 103D-102(b), the State of Hawaii shall not enter into a
7	contract with an offeror or any of its principals or its
8	subsidiaries, unless the offeror, principal, or subsidiary, as
9	applicable, attests to the following:
10	(1) Within a seven-year period preceding the offer, it has
11	not been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered
12	against it for:
13	(A) Commission of any felony, including fraud or a
14	criminal offense in connection with obtaining,
15	attempting to obtain, or performing a public
16	contract or subcontract with any federal, state,
17	or local government entity, including contracts
18	in any state;

1	<u>(E</u>	Violation of federal or state antitrust statutes
2		relating to the submission of offers; or
3	,	commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery,
4		bribery, falsification or destruction of records,
5		making false statements, tax evasion, or
6		violating federal criminal tax laws; or
7	<u>(C</u>	Receiving stolen property; and
8	<u>(2)</u> <u>Wi</u>	thin a seven-year period preceding the offer, it has
9	<u>no</u>	t been notified of any delinquent federal taxes in
10	an	amount that exceeds \$3,000 for which the liability
11	<u>re</u>	mains unsatisfied."

13	SECTION	3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
