A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII HIGH IMPACT CENTER FOR COMMERCIALIZATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that to be successful in SECTION 1. 2 the twenty-first century global economy, Hawaii must position 3 itself as a leader in technology development, transfer, and 4 commercialization. Significant progress has been made in the 5 past years through programs supported by federal and state initiatives, but more is required to move Hawaii's technology 6 7 industry to support local manufacturing and technology commercialization. Innovation in the science and technology 8 9 fields will not only enable the State to succeed in the global marketplace, but will also support the State's sustainable 10 11 economic development goals. 12 The purpose of this Act is to build on the successes of 13 Hawaii's science and technology industries and establish a commercialization program, Hawaii High Impact Center for 14 Commercialization (HI-Impact), to support Hawaii-based small 15 businesses in the fields of dual-use technology, agriculture 16 17 development, molecular manufacturing, humanitarian assistance,

and disaster management and response.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 304A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§304A- Hawaii high impact center for
5	commercialization. (a) There is established the Hawaii high
6	impact center for commercialization, to be commonly known as HI-
7	Impact, to support Hawaii-based small businesses in the fields
8	of dual-use technology, innovative agriculture development,
9	molecular manufacturing, humanitarian assistance, and disaster
10	management and response. The center shall be placed within the
11	University of Hawaii office of the vice president for research
12	and innovation for administrative purposes; provided that the
13	Hawaii high impact center for commercialization may incorporate
14	as an independent nonprofit corporation to further its
15	objectives.
16	(b) The purposes of the center shall be to:
17	(1) Develop, implement, and operate a comprehensive
18	technology transfer and commercialization system to
19	help Hawaii's technology industry include a
20	manufacturing readiness program, which shall enable
21	the State's science and technology sector to prepare
22	for manufacturing, sales, and services;

2	•	commercialization activities in the fields of dual-use
3		technology, innovative agriculture development,
4		molecular manufacturing, humanitarian assistance, and
5		disaster management and response;
6	(3)	Provide capital for high-potential business
7		infrastructure development that helps the enterprise
8		achieve commercial success;
9	(4)	Promote high-quality, high-income job opportunities
10		for Hawaii's residents and graduates of Hawaii's
11		educational institutions;
12	(5)	Reverse "brain drain" by providing jobs to allow
13		talented scientists and engineers to return home to
14		living-wage jobs in Hawaii; and
15	(6)	Keep high technology companies in Hawaii by limiting
16		the need to seek out-of-state venture capital, which
17		dilutes local ownership.
18	<u>(c)</u>	If the center incorporates, to qualify for state
19	funds, it	shall:
20	(1)	Be incorporated pursuant to chapter 414D;
21	(2)	Agree not to use state funds for entertainment or

1	<u>(3)</u>	Be a nonprofit organization exempt from the federal	
2		income tax by the Internal Revenue Service;	
3	(4)	Maintain bylaws or policies specifying how grant or	
4		subsidy awards for activities or services shall be	
5		conducted or provided; and	
6	(5)	Maintain a governing board of directors consisting	
7		entirely of persons who have no material conflict of	
8		interest and who serve without compensation.	
9	<u>(d)</u>	The center may seek, receive, and accept from public	
10	and priva	te sources, whether located within or without the	
11	United St	ates, grants, gifts, devises, bequests, or any other	
12	money or	property, real, personal, or mixed, tangible or	
13	intangibl	e, absolutely or in trust, to be used in carrying out	
14	the purpo	ses of the center.	
15	<u>(e)</u>	For purposes of this section, "center" means the	
16	<u>Hawaii hi</u>	gh impact center for commercialization."	
17	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
18	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so	
19	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for		
20	the Hawaii high impact center for commercialization.		
21	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the University of	
22	Hawaii fo	r the purposes of this Act.
