# A BILL FOR AN ACT

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1.	Section 322-1,	Hawaii	Revised	Statutes,	is
2	amended to read	as follows:				

3 "\$322-1 Removal, prevention. The department of health and
4 its agents shall examine into [all]:

5 (1)	<u>All</u> nuisances, foul or noxious odors, gases or vapors,
6	water in which mosquito larvae exist, sources of
7	filth, and all causes of sickness or disease, on
8	shore, and in any vessel, which may be known to them
9	or brought to their attention, which in their opinion
10	are dangerous or injurious to health[, and into any];

- 11 (2) All odors and filth resulting from the feeding of
- 12 feral birds; and

13 (3) Any and all conditions created or existing [which]

14 <u>that</u> cause or tend to cause sickness or disease or to
15 be dangerous or injurious to health,

16 and shall cause the same to be abated, destroyed, removed, or 17 prevented.

7 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that 8 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 9 begun before its effective date.
