
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE
FORTY-FIFTH REPRESENTATIVE DISTRICT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The director of finance is authorized to issue
2 general obligation bonds in the sum of \$46,298,000 or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
4 as may be necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2014-2015
5 for the purpose of improving the following school facilities in
6 the forty-fifth representative district.

2 SECTION 2. The sums appropriated for the respective
3 capital projects set forth in section 1 shall be expended by the
4 designated expending agency for the purposes of this Act.

5 SECTION 3. The appropriation made for the capital
6 improvement projects authorized by this Act shall not lapse at
7 the end of the fiscal biennium for which the appropriation is
8 made; provided that all moneys from the appropriation
9 unencumbered as of June 30, 2016, shall lapse as of that date.

10 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2014.
