
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PERSONAL INFORMATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 487J-6, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

3 "(a) No business may scan the machine-readable zone of an
4 individual's Hawaii identification card or driver's license,
5 except for the following purposes:

- 6 (1) To verify authenticity of the identification card or
7 driver's license or to verify the identity of the
8 individual if the individual pays for goods or
9 services with a method other than cash, returns an
10 item, or requests a refund or an exchange;
- 11 (2) To verify the individual's age when providing age-
12 restricted goods or services to the individual if [~~the~~
13 ~~business has~~] there is a reasonable doubt of the
14 individual having reached the minimum age required for
15 purchasing the age-restricted goods or services;
- 16 (3) To prevent fraud or other criminal activity if the
17 individual returns an item or requests a refund or an
18 exchange and the business uses a fraud prevention



1 service company or system. Information collected by
2 scanning an individual's Hawaii identification card or
3 driver's license pursuant to this subsection shall be
4 limited to the following information from the
5 individual:

6 (A) Name;

7 (B) Address;

8 (C) Date of birth; and

9 (D) Driver's license number or identification card
10 number;

11 (4) To establish or maintain a contractual relationship.
12 Information collected by scanning the individual's
13 Hawaii identification card or driver's license
14 pursuant to this subsection shall be limited to the
15 following information from the individual:

16 (A) Name;

17 (B) Address;

18 (C) Date of birth; and

19 (D) Driver's license number or identification card
20 number;

21 (5) To record, retain, or transmit information as required
22 by state or federal law;



1 (6) To transmit information to a consumer reporting
 2 agency, financial institution, or debt collector to be
 3 used as permitted by the federal Fair Credit Reporting
 4 Act, Gramm-Leach-Bliley Act, or the Fair Debt
 5 Collection Practices Act; and

6 (7) To record, retain, or transmit information by a
 7 covered entity governed by the medical privacy and
 8 security rules issued by the federal Department of
 9 Health and Human Services, parts 160 and 164 of title
 10 45 of the Code of Federal Regulations, established
 11 pursuant to the Health Insurance Portability and
 12 Accountability Act of 1996."

13 SECTION 2. Act 195, Session Laws of Hawaii 2013, is
 14 amended by amending section 3 to read as follows:

15 "SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval[
 16 ~~provided that on July 31, 2014, this Act shall be repealed and~~
 17 ~~section 487J-6(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted~~
 18 ~~in the form it which it read on the day prior to the effective~~
 19 ~~date of this Act]."~~

20 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 21 and stricken. New material is underscored.

22 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.



Report Title:

ID Card; Driver's License; Scan; Age-Restricted Goods

Description:

Makes permanent the amendments allowing a business to scan an individual's driver's license or Hawaii identification card to verify age when providing age-restricted goods or services. Removes reference to "the business" from the reasonable doubt standard for proof of age. (HB2666 HD1)
