
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 349, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3 and to read as follows:

4 "§349- Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services
5 coordinator. There is established within the executive office
6 on aging an Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services
7 coordinator to coordinate the provision of public and private
8 Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services. The
9 coordinator shall be appointed by the director in accordance
10 with chapters 76 and 89."

11 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
12 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
13 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and
14 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
15 year 2014-2015 to establish an Alzheimer's disease and related
16 dementia services coordinator.

17 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
18 of health for the purposes of this Act.



1 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$9,000,000 or so much
3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
4 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
5 2014-2015 for the kupuna care program; provided that the sum
6 appropriated shall be in addition to the base budget of the
7 executive office on aging.

8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
9 of health for the purposes of this Act.

10 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$1,800,000 or so much
12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
13 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
14 2014-2015 for the aging and disability resource center.

15 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
16 of health for the purposes of this Act.

17 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general
18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$285,000 or so much
19 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
20 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
21 2014-2015 to provide funding for grants, pursuant to chapter



1 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for senior centers and to be
2 distributed as follows:

- 3 (1) Catholic Charities Hawaii for the
- 4 Lanakila multi-purpose senior center \$175,000;
- 5 (2) Moiliili Community Center for the
- 6 Moiliili senior center \$50,000; and
- 7 (3) Waikiki Community Center \$60,000;

8 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
9 of health for the purposes of this Act.

10 SECTION 6. There is appropriated out of the general
11 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$476,772 or so much
12 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014 and the
13 same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
14 2014-2015 for the healthy aging partnership program of the
15 department of health's executive office on aging.


16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
17 of health for the purposes of this Act.

18 SECTION 7. New statutory material is underscored.

19 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.

Kupuna Caucus; Aging; Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia Services Coordinator; Kupuna Care; Aging and Disability Resource Center; Senior Centers; Healthy Aging Partnership; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes and funds a position for an Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services coordinator within the executive office on aging.
