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## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE CHAIRPERSON OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE TO CREATE  
AN INDUSTRIAL HEMP ADVISORY BOARD.

1           WHEREAS, industrial hemp is an agricultural crop that is  
2 grown in at least thirty countries, including Australia, Canada,  
3 China, France, Germany, Great Britain, and Romania; and  
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5           WHEREAS, industrial hemp is used by industries to produce  
6 goods such as paper, textiles, food, oils, automotive parts, and  
7 personal care products; and  
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9           WHEREAS, sales of industrial hemp products in the United  
10 States have grown steadily since 1990 to more than \$500,000,000  
11 annually in 2012; and  
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13           WHEREAS, a critical logistical factor in gaining the  
14 acceptance of industrial hemp as an agricultural product appears  
15 to be the monitoring and maintaining of acceptably low levels of  
16 tetrahydrocannabinol concentrations in the hemp plants; now,  
17 therefore,  
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19           BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
20 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular  
21 Session of 2014, the Senate concurring, that the Chairperson of  
22 the Board of Agriculture is requested to create an industrial  
23 hemp advisory board; and  
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25           BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairperson of the Board of  
26 Agriculture is requested to invite the following to serve on the  
27 advisory board:  
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29           (1) Four members from the agricultural industry;

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31           (2) Two members from public or private institutions or  
32 organizations that maintain land for agricultural



1 research, including colleges, universities,  
2 agricultural research centers, and conservation  
3 research centers;

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5 (3) One member from a state or county law enforcement  
6 agency;

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8 (4) One member who engages in hemp research at the  
9 University of Hawaii;

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11 (5) One member from the industrial hemp products  
12 manufacturing or processing industry;

14 (6) One member from the industrial hemp products marketing  
15 industry; and

17 (7) One member of the public;

21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the advisory board is requested  
22 to examine the following issues:

24 (1) Identification of new and existing varieties of  
25 industrial hemp that may be grown for their grain or  
26 fiber as a dual purpose crop and those that may be  
27 grown for seed production; and

28  
29 (2) The feasibility of permitting public or private  
30 institutions or organizations that maintain land for  
31 agricultural research, including colleges,  
32 universities, agricultural research centers, and  
33 conservation research centers, to cultivate or possess  
34 any sample of industrial hemp that contains a  
35 percentage content of tetrahydrocannabinol that is  
36 greater than three-tenths of one per cent; provided  
37 that the cultivation or possession of that sample  
38 contributes to the development of a variety of  
39 industrial hemp that does not contain a percentage  
40 content of tetrahydrocannabinol that is greater than  
41 three-tenths of one per cent;
