
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO CONSIDER THE NEED TO PROTECT CHILDREN FROM HEAT AND SUN EXPOSURE, IN ADDITION TO RAINFALL, WHEN ASSESSING THE NEED FOR COVERED PLAY YARDS AT PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

1 WHEREAS, sunlight and heat produced from sunlight can be
2 very intense in Hawaii, especially during the middle of the day;
3 and

5 WHEREAS, exposure to bright sunlight and heat can cause
6 fatigue, dehydration, and other health issues; and
7

8 WHEREAS, children are commonly restricted to playing in
9 certain locations such as play yards while attending school; and
10

11 WHEREAS, children can be especially susceptible to health
12 risks associated with bright sunlight and heat; and
13

14 WHEREAS, rain can prevent children from playing in
15 uncovered play yards; and
16

17 WHEREAS, there is a need to consider creating more covered
18 play yards at public schools; now, therefore,

20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
21 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
22 Session of 2014, the Senate concurring, that the Department of
23 Education is urged to consider the effects of heat and sun
24 exposure, in addition to rain, when assessing the need for
25 covered play yards at public schools; and
