ESTABLISHING A WORKING GROUP TO EXPLORE STRATEGIES TO ALLOW DOGS IN PARTICIPATING RESTAURANTS AND BARS.

WHEREAS, many jurisdictions on the mainland and in Europe 1 allow customers to bring dogs into restaurants and bars; and 2 3 WHEREAS, a recent national poll found that more than ninety 4 per cent of pet owners considered their pets to be members of 5 their families; and 6 7 WHEREAS, spending time with pets has been found to relieve 8 stress and anger and to have other positive health benefits; and 9 10 WHEREAS, sixty per cent of Oahu households include pets, 11 and dog ownership has substantially increased over the last two 12 13 decades; and 14 WHEREAS, Hawaii's dog owners seek opportunities to spend 15 quality time with their animals; and 16 17 WHEREAS, an important concern for stakeholders is to ensure 18 the safety of service animals if dogs are allowed in restaurants 19 and bars; and 20 21 WHEREAS, addressing food safety and health concerns is also 22 of primary importance; now, therefore, 23 24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 25 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 26 Session of 2014, that the Department of Health is requested to 27 establish the Dogs in Restaurants and Bars Working Group; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health and 30 the Disability and Communications Access Board is requested to 31 participate in the working group; and 32
