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# HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING COMMUNITY AWARENESS OF AMYOTROPHIC LATERAL SCLEROSIS,  
ALSO KNOWN AS ALS OR LOU GEHRIG'S DISEASE, AND COMMUNITY  
SUPPORT FOR FINDING A CURE FOR ALS AND THE PROVISION OF  
ASSISTANCE TO ALS PATIENTS.

1           WHEREAS, amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), also known as  
2 Lou Gehrig's disease, is a progressive, fatal neurodegenerative  
3 disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and the spinal  
4 cord; and

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6           WHEREAS, early symptoms of ALS often include increasing  
7 muscle weakness, especially involving the arms and legs, speech,  
8 swallowing, or breathing; and

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10          WHEREAS, the progressive degeneration of the motor neurons  
11 in an ALS patient eventually leads to death; and

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13          WHEREAS, ALS does not typically affect a patient's mental  
14 capacity, and thus, the patient usually remains alert and aware  
15 of the loss of motor functions and the inevitable outcome of  
16 deterioration and death; and

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18          WHEREAS, on average, ALS patients survive only two to five  
19 years after the ALS diagnosis is made; and

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21          WHEREAS, ALS has no known cause, means of prevention, or  
22 cure; and

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24          WHEREAS, research indicates that military veterans are  
25 about twice as likely to develop ALS as compared to those who  
26 have not served in the military; and

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28          WHEREAS, the United States Department of Veterans Affairs  
29 implemented regulations to establish a presumption of service  
30 connection for ALS, thereby presuming that the development of  
31 ALS was incurred or aggravated by a veteran's service in the  
32 military; and



1 WHEREAS, the National ALS Registry, which is primarily  
2 administered by the federal Agency for Toxic Substances and  
3 Disease Registry, which is in turn a sister agency of the  
4 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, may be the single  
5 largest ALS research project ever created; and

6  
7 WHEREAS, persons living with ALS can also add their  
8 information to the National ALS Registry to help scientists  
9 learn more about the disease; and

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11 WHEREAS, due to his affliction with ALS, Lou Gehrig, the  
12 pride of the Yankees, bid farewell to baseball in a famous  
13 speech given at Yankee Stadium on July 4, 1939; and

14  
15 WHEREAS, 2014 is the 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of that speech, and  
16 this anniversary will be observed during the National ALS  
17 Association's advocacy gathering in May 2014, in Washington,  
18 D.C., with generous support from Major and Minor League Baseball  
19 across the country; and

20  
21 WHEREAS, Hawaii has joined with other groups nationally to  
22 increase public awareness of:

24 (1) The circumstances and experiences which ALS patients  
25 face in combatting this fatal disease;  
26  
27 (2) The terrible impact ALS has not only on ALS patients  
28 but on their families; and  
29  
30 (3) The research being done to treat and eradicate this  
31 rapidly progressive and fatal disease; now, therefore,  
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33 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the  
34 Twenty-seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular  
35 Session of 2014, that this body hereby urges community support  
36 for, and awareness in, finding a cure for ALS and the provision  
37 of assistance to ALS patients; and

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39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the community is further urged  
40 to support the "Walk to Defeat ALS," scheduled for Saturday,  
41 September 6, 2014, at 11:00 a.m., at Kapiolani Regional Park in  
42 Honolulu, Hawaii, as a joint community awareness event; and  
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1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the ALS Ohana of Hawaii and the  
2 ALS Association Golden West Chapter in Agoura Hills, California,  
3 be recognized for their joint efforts to achieve the goal of a  
4 Hawaii ALS Registry; and

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6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this  
7 Resolution be transmitted to members of Hawaii's delegation to  
8 Congress, the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, the Governor  
9 of the State of Hawaii, the State Office of Veterans Services,  
10 the National ALS Association, the ALS Golden West Chapter, the  
11 John A. Burns School of Medicine, the Hawaii Medical  
12 Association, the ALS Ohana of Hawaii, the Muscular Dystrophy  
13 Association of Hawaii, and the Hawaii Association of Health  
14 Plans, which is requested to provide copies of this Resolution  
15 to its members.

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
