A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY CONTROL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the office of
2 environmental quality control needs to upgrade and improve its
3 technology infrastructure and fully staff its functions in order
4 to fulfill its duty to ensure environmental protection in
5 Hawaii.

6 The purposes of this Act are to:

- 7 (1) Establish the environmental review special fund;
8 (2) Establish fees to enhance the activities of the office
9 of environmental quality control;
10 (3) Authorize the office to expend moneys out of the
11 environmental review special fund;
12 (4) Support and maintain technology systems for the office
13 of environmental quality control;
14 (5) Support outreach, training, education, and research
15 regarding environmental stewardship; and
16 (6) Provide for the hiring of adequate staff for the
17 office.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 341, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended by adding three new sections to be appropriately
3 designated and to read as follows:

4 "§341-A Environmental review special fund; use of funds.

5 (a) There is established in the state treasury the
6 environmental review special fund, into which shall be
7 deposited:

8 (1) All filing fees and other administrative fees
9 collected by the office;

10 (2) Moneys collected pursuant to section 341-B;

11 (3) All accrued interest from the special fund; and

12 (4) Moneys appropriated to the special fund by the
13 legislature.

14 (b) Moneys in the environmental review special fund shall
15 be used to:

16 (1) Fund the activities of the office and the council in
17 fulfillment of their duties pursuant to this chapter
18 and chapter 343, including servicing of agency
19 documents relating to the environmental review
20 process, administrative support including staffing,
21 and office expenses;

22 (2) Support technology, maintain technology systems, and
23 develop technology training programs; and

1 (3) Support outreach, training, education, and research
2 programs pursuant to section 341-4.

3 **§341-B Fees.** (a) No later than June 30, 2016, the
4 office, in consultation with the council, shall adopt rules
5 pursuant to chapter 91 to establish fees necessary for the
6 administration and management of the office and the council.

7 (b) The office shall collect fees from all applicants,
8 including state and county agencies that are required to file
9 environmental review documents with the office pursuant to
10 chapter 343.

11 (c) The office shall waive the filing fees required by
12 this section for an applicant who demonstrates that:

13 (1) The cost of the proposed action does not exceed
14 \$500,000;

15 (2) The applicant's annual revenue does not exceed
16 \$1,000,000; and

17 (3) The applicant has fewer than ten employees.

18 **§341-C Reporting.** No later than twenty days prior to the
19 convening of the regular session of each year, beginning with
20 the regular session of 2014, the office shall submit a report to
21 the legislature containing the following information for the
22 previous calendar year:

- 1 (1) The number and type of environmental review documents
2 filed with the office, including the amount of the
3 fees received for each document;
- 4 (2) For each environmental document filed with the office,
5 whether the applicant is a county or state agency or a
6 private entity; and
- 7 (3) The total amount of fees collected pursuant to section
8 341-B and section 4 of Act , Session Laws of
9 Hawaii 2013."

10 SECTION 3. Section 341-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
11 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

12 "(a) There is created an office of environmental quality
13 control that shall be headed by a single executive to be known
14 as the director of environmental quality control who shall be
15 appointed by the governor as provided in section 26-34. This
16 office shall implement this chapter and shall be placed within
17 the department of health for administrative purposes. The office
18 shall perform its duties under chapter 343 and shall serve the
19 governor in an advisory capacity on all matters relating to
20 environmental quality control. The director may appoint
21 personnel exempt from chapters 76 and 89."

22 SECTION 4. The office of environmental quality control
23 shall collect interim filing fees from all applicants, including

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1 state and county agencies that are required to file
2 environmental review documents pursuant to chapter 343, Hawaii
3 Revised Statutes. Until superseded by fees established pursuant
4 to section 341-B, Hawaii Revised Statutes, in section 2 of this
5 Act, or June 30, 2016, whichever is sooner, the interim filing
6 fees shall be as follows:

- 7 (1) \$500 for a draft environmental assessment;
- 8 (2) \$300 for a final environmental assessment;
- 9 (3) \$200 for other significant addenda to a draft
10 environmental assessment;
- 11 (4) \$200 for an environmental impact statement preparation
12 notice;
- 13 (5) \$200 for a supplemental environmental impact statement
14 preparation notice;
- 15 (6) \$500 for a draft environmental impact statement;
- 16 (7) \$300 for a final environmental impact statement;
- 17 (8) \$500 for a revised draft environmental impact
18 statement;
- 19 (9) \$300 for a revised final environmental impact
20 statement;
- 21 (10) \$500 for a supplemental draft environmental impact
22 statement; and

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1 Hawaii Revised Statutes, established and assessed by section 2
2 and section 4 of this Act, respectively, for one hundred eighty
3 days from the date of the enactment of this Act.

Office of Environmental Quality Control; Fees; Special Fund

Description:

Establishes filing fees to help fund operations of the Office of Environmental Quality Control; creates a special fund and authorizes expenditures out of the special fund; and provides for a lag time for collection of fees.

JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT: Health

TITLE: A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY CONTROL.

PURPOSE: The purpose of this bill is to establish a special fund and fees to assist in funding the activities of the Office of Environmental Quality Control (OEQC) and the Environmental Council; support, modernize and maintain technology systems; support outreach, training, education, and research; and provide for the hiring of adequate staff under chapter 343, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

MEANS: Add three new sections to chapter 341, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS), and amend subsection 341-3(a), HRS.

JUSTIFICATION: General fund appropriations have not kept pace with the expanding workload of the OEQC which has resulted in longer wait times for public and private projects. Operations are further hampered by an outdated information technology infrastructure.

The establishment of fees, rule-making authority, and a special fund will provide a revenue stream that roughly correlates with demand and creates enhanced flexibility to meet evolving needs as sensitivity to environmental impacts grows.

Impact on the public: The proposed fees will not have a direct impact on the public. The fees will apply only to proponents of development projects that require review under chapter 343, HRS, the Hawaii Environmental Policy Act (HEPA).

Impact on the department and other agencies: This measure will generate funds to support OEQC statutory functions. Information management will improve and the funds will

allow the OEQC to maintain its data-base system being requested in the OEQC's budget for the 2013-2014 fiscal year. State and county agencies will bear the cost for any agency project that requires review under chapter 343, HRS.

GENERAL FUND: None.

OTHER FUNDS: Based on recent averages, potential revenue of approximately \$100,000.

PPBS PROGRAM DESIGNATION: HTH-850.

OTHER AFFECTED AGENCIES: All state, county, and federal agencies.

EFFECTIVE DATE: July 1, 2013.
