A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there are currently
2	hundreds of individuals on the island of Oahu that are at risk
3	of losing necessary long-term care services due to recent
4	funding changes. Prior to November 2013, long-term care
5	services needed by aging and disabled medicaid beneficiaries
6	were paid for by kupuna care or federal Older Americans Act
7	funds. Long-term care services include personal care, attendant
8	care, congregate meals, home delivered meals, assisted
9	transportation, and kupuna care transportation. As of November
10	2013, long-term care services for medicaid beneficiaries are no
11	longer covered by kupuna care or Older Americans Act funds.
12	The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for aging
13	and disabled individuals on medicaid to continue to receive
14	necessary long-term care services.
15	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
16	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
17	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for
18	necessary long-term care services for aging and disabled

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- 1 individuals on medicaid; provided that the sum appropriated
 - 2 shall be in addition to the base budget of the department of
 - 3 human services.
 - 4 The sum shall be appropriated to the department of human
 - 5 services; provided that the department of human services shall
 - 6 transfer the appropriated sum to the executive office on aging
 - 7 to effectuate the purposes of this Act; provided further that
 - 8 the funds shall not be co-mingled with kupuna care funds.
 - 9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
