A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO VIOLENCE AGAINST HEALTH CARE PERSONNEL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Section 707-711, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by	y amending subsection (1) to read as follows:
3	"(1)	A person commits the offense of assault in the second
4	degree if	:
5	(a)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes
6		substantial bodily injury to another;
7	(b)	The person recklessly causes serious or substantial
8		bodily injury to another;
9	(c)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
10		injury to a correctional worker, as defined in section
11		710-1031(2), who is engaged in the performance of duty
12		or who is within a correctional facility;
13	(d)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
14		injury to another with a dangerous instrument;
15	(e)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
16		injury to an educational worker who is engaged in the
17		performance of duty or who is within an educational
18		facility. For the purposes of this paragraph,

1		"educational worker" means any administrator,
2		specialist, counselor, teacher, or employee of the
3		department of education or an employee of a charter
4		school; a person who is a volunteer, as defined in
5		section 90-1, in a school program, activity, or
6		function that is established, sanctioned, or approved
7		by the department of education; or a person hired by
8		the department of education on a contractual basis and
9		engaged in carrying out an educational function;
10	(f)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
11		injury to any [emergency] medical services provider
12		who is engaged in the performance of duty. For the
13		purposes of this paragraph, ["emergency medical
14		services provider" medical services provider means
15		emergency medical services personnel, as defined in
16		section 321-222, and physicians, physician's
17		assistants, nurses, [nurse practitioners, certified
18		registered nurse anesthetists, advanced practice
19		registered nurses, respiratory therapists, laboratory
20		technicians, radiology technicians, [and] social
21		workers, and unlicensed medical professionals or other
22		medical staff involved in the direct care of patients,

1		providing services in [the emergency room or] a
2		hospital[+], medical clinic, or federally qualified
3		health center;
4	(g)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
5		injury to a person employed at a state-operated or
6		-contracted mental health facility. For the purposes
7		of this paragraph, "a person employed at a state-
8		operated or -contracted mental health facility"
9		includes health care professionals as defined in
10		section 451D-2, administrators, orderlies, security
11	•	personnel, volunteers, and any other person who is
12		engaged in the performance of a duty at a state-
13		operated or -contracted mental health facility;
14	(h)	The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
15		injury to a person who:
16		(i) The defendant has been restrained from, by order
17		of any court, including an ex parte order,
18		contacting, threatening, or physically abusing
19		pursuant to chapter 586; or
20		(ii) Is being protected by a police officer ordering
21		the defendant to leave the premises of that

1	protected person pursuant to section 709-906(4),
2	during the effective period of that order; or
3	[+](i)[+] The person intentionally or knowingly causes bodily
4	injury to any firefighter or water safety officer who
5	is engaged in the performance of duty. For the
6	purposes of this paragraph, "firefighter" has the same
7	meaning as in section 710-1012 and "water safety
8	officer" means any public servant employed by the
9	United States, the State, or any county as a lifeguard
10	or person authorized to conduct water rescue or ocean
11	safety functions."
12	SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
13	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
14	begun before its effective date.
15	SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
16	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
17	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2100.
