A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAIIAN HOMES COMMISSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1		PART I
2	SECT	ION 1. The purpose of this Act is to establish a
3	candidate	advisory council for the Hawaiian homes commission to
4	present n	ominees to the governor for the appointment of
5	individua	ls to serve on the Hawaiian homes commission. This Act
6	also:	
7	(1)	Requires all members of the Hawaiian homes commission
8		to be of Hawaiian ancestry;
9	(2)	Requires the ninth member of the commission to be an
10		at-large member, rather than the chairperson of the
11		commission;
12	(3)	Requires the members of the commission, rather than
13		the governor, to select a chairperson from among the
14		members thereof at the end of each fiscal year; and
15	(4)	Changes the term of the chairperson from commencing on
16		January 1 and expiring on December 31 to a one-year
17		term commencing on July 1 and expiring on June 30.

1	SECT	ION 2. The Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as
2	amended,	is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately
3	designate	d and to read as follows:

6	Hawaiian	homes commission shall recruit, evaluate, and present
7	to the go	vernor qualified candidates for nomination to a vacant

9	attached	to the department of Hawaiian home lands for
10	administr	ative purposes.
11	(b)	The candidate advisory council shall:
12	(1)	Develop and implement a fair and independent procedure
13		for evaluating candidates to serve on the commission;
14	(2)	Require candidates and members of their immediate
15		families to disclose any existing or anticipated
16		contracts or financial transactions with the
17		department of Hawaiian home lands;
18	(3)	Actively solicit and accept applications from
19		<pre>potential candidates;</pre>
20	(4)	Evaluate candidates for the commission on their
21		background, experience, and potential for discharging
22		the responsibilities of a member of the commission

2		Homes Commission Act, 1920, as amended; and
3	(5)	Present a list of three candidates who have received a
4		majority vote by the candidate advisory council to the
5		governor for nomination and appointment for each
6		vacant seat on the commission.
7	(c)	The candidate advisory council shall initiate the
8	recruitme	nt and evaluation of candidates for each vacancy on the
9	commissio	n within:
10	(1)	Sixty days of a vacancy; or
11	(2)	At least one hundred twenty days prior to the

1 council shall run for or hold elective office of the State or 2 any of its political subdivisions while serving on the candidate 3 advisory council. A member of the candidate advisory council shall resign from the candidate advisory council prior to filing 4 5 nomination papers for an elective office of the State or any of 6 its political subdivisions. 7 (g) A majority of the members of the candidate advisory 8 council shall constitute a quorum to conduct business. 9 concurrence of a majority of the members of the candidate 10 advisory council shall be necessary to make any action of the candidate advisory council valid. The candidate advisory 11 council shall meet annually and at other times as necessary. 12 13 The candidate advisory council shall be exempt from part I of 14 chapter 92, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 15 (h) A vacancy occurring in the membership of the candidate advisory council during a term shall be filled for the remainder 16 of the unexpired term thereof by the appointing authority who 17 18 appointed the member who creates the vacancy. Any member of the 19 candidate advisory council whose term has expired may continue

in office as a holdover member until a successor is appointed;

provided that a holdover member shall not hold office for more

- 12 native Hawaiian rehabilitation fund. No contract shall be for a
- 13 period longer than two years, but individuals hired under
- 14 contract may be employed for a maximum of six years; provided
- 15 that the six-year limitation shall not apply if the department,
- 16 with the approval of the governor, determines that such contract
- 17 individuals are needed to provide critical services for the
- 18 efficient functioning of the department. All other positions in
- 19 the department shall be subject to chapter 76, Hawaii Revised
- 20 Statutes.

- 20 consent of the senate, appointed by the governor. Unless
- 21 otherwise provided by this chapter or by law hereafter enacted,
- 22 the terms of the members shall be for four years; provided that

- 1 the governor may reduce the terms of those initially appointed
- 2 so as to provide, as nearly as can be, for the expiration of an
- 3 equal number of terms at intervals of one year for each board
- 4 and commission. Unless otherwise provided by law, each term
- 5 shall commence on July 1 and expire on June 30, except that the
- 6 terms of the chairpersons of the board of agriculture [-7] and the
- 7 board of land and natural resources [, and the Hawaiian homes
- 8 commission] shall commence on January 1 and expire on
- 9 December 31. No person shall be appointed consecutively to more
- 10 than two terms as a member of the same board or commission;
- 11 provided that membership on any board or commission shall not
- 12 exceed eight consecutive years."

13 PART IV

14 SECTION 6. The provisions of the amendments made by part

15 II of this Act to the Hawaiian Homes Commission Act, 1920, as

16 amended, are declared to be severable, and if any section,

17 sentence, clause, or phrase, or the application thereof to any

18 person or circumstances is held ineffective because there is a

19 requirement of having the consent of the United States to take

20 effect, then that portion only shall take effect upon the

21 granting of consent by the United States and effectiveness of

- 1 the remainder of these amendments or the application thereof
- 2 shall not be affected.
- 3 SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

Hawaiian Homes Commission; Nomination, Members; Chairperson

Description:

Establishes a candidate advisory council for the Hawaiian homes commission to present nominees to the governor for the appointment of individuals to serve on the Hawaiian homes commission. Requires all members of the Hawaiian homes commission to be of Hawaiian ancestry. Establishes the ninth member of the Hawaiian homes commission as an at-large member. Requires the members rather than the governor to select a chairperson from among the members thereof at the end of each fiscal year. Changes the term of the chairperson from commencing on January 1 and expiring on December 31 to a one-year term commencing on July 1 and expiring on June 30. Takes effect 7/1/2050. (SD1)
