A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) There is established within the department
2 of health for administrative purposes a medical marijuana reform
3 task force.

4 (b) The task force shall consist of the following members,
5 who shall be appointed by the governor:

6 (1) One individual from the department of health;

7 (2) One individual from the Drug Policy Forum of Hawaii;

8 (3) One individual from the American Civil Liberties
9 Union;

10 (4) Two medical marijuana patients certified and
11 registered pursuant to section 329-123, Hawaii Revised
12 Statutes;

13 (5) Two primary caregivers of medical marijuana patients
14 registered pursuant to section 329-123, Hawaii Revised
15 Statutes;

16 (6) Two physicians; and

17 (7) Two individuals at large.

18 (c) The task force shall:

1 (1) Identify, research, and develop best practices for the
2 use and dispensing of medical marijuana; and

3 (2) Suggest improvements to Hawaii's medical marijuana
4 policies and laws.


5 (d) The members of the task force shall serve without
6 compensation but shall be reimbursed for expenses, including
7 travel expenses, necessary for the performance of their duties.

8 (e) The members of the task force shall meet at least five
9 times and shall hold at least one public hearing to receive
10 input from the general public. The task force shall submit a
11 report of the task force's findings and recommendations,
12 including any proposed legislation, to the legislature no later
13 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
14 of 2015.

15 (f) The medical marijuana reform task force shall cease to
16 exist on June 30, 2015.

17 SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
