
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 349-3.2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 "~~§~~**349-3.2**~~§~~ **Alzheimer's disease and related dementia**
4 **services coordinator.** There is established within the executive
5 office on aging an Alzheimer's disease and related dementia
6 services coordinator to coordinate the provision of public and
7 private Alzheimer's disease and related dementia services~~[-]~~ and
8 to coordinate and support efforts to:

9 (1) Prevent and treat Alzheimer's disease;

10 (2) Enhance the quality and efficiency of Alzheimer's
11 disease care;

12 (3) Expand supports for people with Alzheimer's disease
13 and their families;

14 (4) Enhance public awareness of Alzheimer's disease and
15 its symptoms; and

16 (5) Improve the collection and analysis of data tracking
17 efforts for the prevention and treatment of
18 Alzheimer's disease.



1 The coordinator shall be appointed by the director in accordance
2 with chapters 76 and 89."

3 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
4 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much
5 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2014-2015 for the
6 establishment of one full-time equivalent (1.00 FTE) position in
7 the executive office on aging to assist the Alzheimer's disease
8 and related dementia services coordinator with information and
9 referral, counseling, education, support groups, and safety
10 services.

11 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
12 health for the purposes of this Act.

13 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
14 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

15 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2150.
