## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIANS.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 455-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
2	amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted				
3	and to read as follows:				
4	"Continuing education courses" means courses approved by a				
5	professional association or organization representing a licensed				
6	profession whose program objectives are related to naturopathic				
7	medicine; provided that the professional association or				
8	organization is approved by the board."				
9	SECTION 2. Section 455-8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is				
10	amended to read as follows:				
11	" $$455-8$ License to practice; biennial registration[-]:				
12	continuing education. (a) Licenses to practice naturopathic				
13	medicine shall be issued by the board to those who qualify				
14	according to this chapter. Naturopathic physicians licensed				
15	under this chapter shall observe and be subject to all state				
16	requirements relative to reporting births and all matters				
17	pertaining to the public health with equal rights and				
18	obligations as physicians, surgeons, and practitioners of other				

- 1 schools of medicine. These equal rights shall apply to all
- 2 matters of public health, including the performance of medical
- 3 examinations and evaluations.
- 4 (b) Every licensee shall renew the licensee's license on
- 5 or before December 31 of each odd-numbered year. Failure to
- 6 renew the license on or before December 31 of each odd-numbered
- 7 year shall automatically constitute a forfeiture of the license;
- 8 provided that the license shall be restored upon written
- 9 application therefor together with payment of the renewal fee,
- 10 all delinquent fees, [and] a penalty fee [-], and, beginning with
- 11 the December 31, 2017, renewal, satisfactory proof of compliance
- 12 with the continuing education requirements set forth in this
- 13 section.
- (c) Beginning with the December 31, 2017, renewal and
- 15 prior to every biennial renewal thereafter, each licensee shall
- 16 complete at least thirty-five hours of continuing education
- 17 courses within the two-year period preceding the renewal date,
- 18 including a minimum of fifteen hours of continuing education
- 19 courses in pharmacology within every licensing biennium.
- 20 (d) A licensee who graduated from a school, university, or
- 21 college of naturopathic medicine pursuant to section 455-3
- 22 within one year of the licensee's first renewal period shall not

1	be subject to the continuing education requirement for the first							
2	license renewal.							
3	(e) Each licensee shall be responsible for maintaining the							
4	licensee'	licensee's continuing education records, including but not						
5	limited t	limited to certificates of completion of the continuing						
6	education	education courses.						
7	<u>(f)</u>	(f) Prior to December 31 of each odd-numbered year, each						
8	licensee shall:							
9	(1)	Complete the renewal form prescribed by the board and						
10		certify that the licensee has complied with the						
11		continuing education requirement of this section for						
12		the applicable renewal period; and						
13	(2)	Submit evidence of completion of the continuing						
14		education courses taken during the applicable renewal

16		certificates of completion. At a minimum,						
17		documentation shall contain the following information:

7	amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows:

## Report Title:

Naturopathic Medicine; Naturopathic Physicians; Continuing Education

## Description:

Requires naturopathic physicians to complete a minimum of thirty-five hours of continuing education courses, including a minimum of fifteen hours of pharmacology, during each licensing renewal biennium, beginning December 31, 2017. (CD1)

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
