# A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE CONTRACTORS LICENSE BOARD.

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:**

- 1           SECTION 1. Section 444-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is  
2 amended by:
- 3           1. Amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
- 4           "(a) There shall be a contractors license board of  
5 [~~thirteen~~] fifteen members.
- 6           (b) Of the board members:
- 7           (1) [~~Ten~~] Twelve shall be contractors who have been  
8 actively engaged in the contracting business for a  
9 period of not less than five years preceding the date  
10 of their appointment;
- 11           (2) [~~Five~~] Of the twelve contractors required under  
12 paragraph (1), five shall be general engineering or  
13 building contractors, [~~five~~] and seven shall be  
14 specialty contractors[~~7~~];
- 15           (3) One shall be affiliated with a state certified  
16 apprenticeship program under chapter 372; and
- 17           (4) [~~three~~] Two shall be noncontractors.

1 No member shall receive any compensation for the member's  
 2 services, but each shall be reimbursed for necessary traveling  
 3 expenses incurred in the performance of duties."

4 2. Amending subsection (d) to read as follows:


5 "(d) No [~~one~~] person, except the [~~three~~] two  
 6 noncontractor members, shall be eligible for appointment to the  
 7 board who does not at the time of the member's appointment hold  
 8 a valid and unexpired license to operate as a contractor."

9 SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed  
 10 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

11 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

**Report Title:**

Contractors License Board; Membership

**Description:**

Increases the membership of the contractors license board from 13 to 15. Increases from 10 to 12 the members who are actively engaged in the contracting business. Increases from 5 to 7 the members who are specialty contractors. Requires that 1 member be affiliated with a state apprenticeship program. Decreases from 3 to 2 the members who are noncontractors.
