
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that an integrated camera
2 surveillance system operated by the state sheriffs will be an
3 efficient and cost effective approach to assist in the security
4 of the historical capitol district. Strategically placed
5 cameras monitored by a central command center will support
6 roving patrols, stationed security, and law enforcement
7 personnel.

8 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
9 public safety to convene a working group to analyze the capitol
10 district security infrastructure and develop a plan to create an
11 integrated camera surveillance system to include the state
12 capitol, Washington Place, the governor's residence, 'Iolani
13 Palace, the Hawaii state art museum, the main Hawaii state
14 library, the Kalanimoku and Aliiolani Hale buildings, and the
15 first district court.

16 SECTION 2. (a) There is established in the department of
17 public safety, for administrative purposes only, a working group
18 that shall analyze the capitol district security infrastructure



1 and develop a plan, including a timeline and funding
2 requirements, to create an integrated camera surveillance
3 system.

4 (b) The working group shall be composed of:

5 (1) The director of public safety, or the director's
6 representative;

7 (2) The state comptroller, or the comptroller's
8 representative;

9 (3) The chief information officer, or the chief
10 information officer's representative;

11 (4) The chief justice of the Hawaii supreme court, or the
12 chief justice's representative;

13 (5) A member appointed by the senate president;

14 (6) A member appointed by the speaker of the house of
15 representatives;

16 (7) No more than two nongovernmental, private sector
17 experts or business persons knowledgeable in camera
18 and security surveillance, appointed by the governor;
19 and

20 (8) A community advocate who will be responsible for
21 collecting, relaying, and resolving public concerns



1 related to camera surveillance, appointed by the
2 governor.

3 (c) The working group shall meet at least four times in
4 2014 and provide a report to the legislature containing its
5 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, no later
6 than twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session
7 of 2015.

8 (d) The members of the working group shall serve without
9 compensation but shall be reimbursed for any necessary expenses
10 incurred in the performance of their official duties.

11 (e) The working group shall be dissolved on June 30, 2015.

12 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
