A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO BEST BUDDIES INTERNATIONAL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Best Buddies
2 International is a non-profit organization that was founded in
3 1989 whose mission is to establish a global volunteer movement
4 that creates opportunities for one-to-one friendships,
5 integrated employment, and leadership development for people
6 with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Best Buddies
7 Hawaii is a non-profit organization and the designated state
8 affiliate of Best Buddies International. Best Buddies Hawaii is
9 dedicated to fostering the social integration of individuals
10 with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Supporting
11 Best Buddies Hawaii chapters enables more of Hawaii's youth with
12 intellectual and developmental disabilities to learn valuable
13 social skills, combat isolation, and gain confidence.

14 The purpose of this Act is to support the efforts of Best
15 Buddies International in Hawaii by appropriating funds to
16 support Best Buddies Hawaii chapters and provide valuable
17 services to youth with intellectual and developmental
18 disabilities.





1 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$100,000 or so much
 3 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2013-2014, as a
 4 grant pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to Best
 5 Buddies Hawaii to support and provide valuable services to youth
 6 with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

7 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
 8 education for the purposes of this Act.


9 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2013.
